St. Thomas Aquinas January 28

Thomas Aquinas was a large man and a brilliant student, but he was quiet and seldom spoke. His classmates called him "the dumb ox."

Thomas's wealthy family sent him at age five to be taught by the Benedictines in hopes that he would join their community and someday become an abbot. But then the Dominican's life-style of prayer and study attracted Thomas more, and he joined them instead. His family was upset and shocked that Thomas, a nobleman, would join a group of poor friars, so they captured Thomas and kept him imprisoned for more than a year in a family castle. Nothing would change his mind, however, and they finally released him to rejoin the Dominicans.

Thomas first studied science under Albert the Great, but he preferred

theology. One of the greatest Christian thinkers and writers, Thomas Aquinas is well known for his writings in philosophy and theology. He reportedly never forgot anything he read and could dictate to four secretaries at the same time on different subjects. His most famous work, the *Summa Theologica*, contains five volumes of his thought on all the Christian mysteries. Though he was considered great even in his own time, he remained humble and quiet. He prayed often and acknowledged that his gifts came from God.

While offering Mass on December 6, 1273, Thomas had a spiritual experience. After that he stopped writing completely. He said after what he had seen, all he had written was just straw. A few months later, the pope invited him to the Council of Lyons in France, but Thomas died on the way.

Thomas had been an adviser to kings, a writer of masterpieces, a counselor to popes, and a teacher of classics. Most of all, Thomas was a servant of God. He is a Doctor of the Church and called "the angelic doctor" for his purity and knowledge.

St. Thomas Aquinas is the patron saint of Catholic schools, students, colleges, philosophers, & theologians.

Reflecting On Sunday's Readings

Many converts to the Catholic Church are emotionally moved and deeply impressed by the veneration of the Word of God which is first encountered in the processional as the people stand and the Holy Scriptures are carried elevated, and then enthroned on the altar. The elevation of the Word, and our standing and crossing ourselves at the reading of the Gospel are rooted not only in our beliefs but also in the historic tradition of Judaism. We see in this week's First Reading as Ezra read the Scriptures aloud the people venerated God, "And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was above all the people; and when he opened it all the people stood...all the people answered, 'Amen, Amen,' lifting up their hands; and they bowed their heads and worshiped the LORD with their faces to the ground ..." This veneration of God through the written Word reflects our conviction that Scripture does in fact contain the presence of the Living Word. This veneration of the Scriptures is explained more fully by Lucien Deiss in his book, *The Mass*: "Vatican II spoke about the 'extreme importance' of God's Word. This extreme importance is the very one of the Eucharist... 'The Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures as she venerated the Body of the Lord, in so far as she never ceases, particularly in the sacred Liturgy, to partake of the bread of life and to offer it to the faithful from the one table of the Word of God and the Body of Christ.' That is why the Magisterium could rightly speak about the 'real presence' of Christ in the Word. "This is a marvelous teaching that, after centuries of forgetfulness or carelessness,

restores the Word to the place that tradition assigned it. Saint Jerome affirmed: 'I think that the Gospel is the body of Christ and that the Holy Scriptures are his doctrine. When the Lord speaks about eating his flesh and drinking his blood certainly this can mean the mystery (of the Eucharist). However, his true body and blood are (also) the Word of the Scriptures and its doctrine.'" Unfortunately, ritual and tradition often lose their meaning when they become familiar. If for a moment we could have Jesus the Living Word appear again in human form to walk down the aisle of our churches we would see the difference. Our response, if we did not simply faint dead away, would be more like Ezra's people. We would bow down and prostrate ourselves in worship and ready obedience. When the Living Word strode to the pulpit we would not simply listen with half an ear but rather would hang on Jesus' every word, believing and obeying it. This is what our ritual and worship is all about, the external expression of inner beliefs and values. During these coming months we will be looking at the Gospel according to Luke. It is not simply one man's depiction of Jesus' life but a Holy Spirit inspired communication by God of his love to us, his people. Let us arise to acknowledge his presence in the Word and listen attentively with the inner ear of our heart to his message to us. "It is Christ who speaks when the Holy Scriptures are read in the Church." (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy)
