Growing as Disciples of Jesus, Making Disciples For Jesus

St. Cyril and St. Methodius Feb. 14th

For most of us, February 14 is known as Valentine's Day—the day on which we send messages of love and friendship. It is also the feast of two great men who knew what real love meant. They showed this love by giving their lives to God and ministering to the Slavic nations. They are Sts. Cyril and Methodius.

Cyril and Methodius were brothers born in Thessalonika, Greece. The younger one, Cyril, a brilliant philosopher, studied in Constantinople and was ordained a priest. Methodius was governor of a Slavic nation and then became a monk. In 861 the two brothers were sent as missionaries to a region of Russia. They learned the language of the people and led many to Christ.

In 863, Cyril and Methodius were sent to Moravia in Eastern Europe. They began translating the Gospels into the Slavic language. To do this, Cyril invented a special alphabet, which is still used in Russia

and in some Slavic countries. Cyril and Methodius ministered to the people as one of them. They celebrated Mass and gave homilies in Slavic. Some German bishops, however, were suspicious of these two from the East. They accused the missionaries of many things. In 869 Cyril and Methodius were called to Rome to defend their actions. Not only were they told to continue preaching and using Slavic in the liturgy, but they were to be consecrated bishops and given their own parts of the country.

Cyril, who had been sick a long time, died before he could be consecrated a bishop. Methodius was consecrated and returned to Moravia where he worked for sixteen more years. Some German bishops continued to accuse him until he was finally disposed by a German synod and imprisoned. Methodius was released two years later by the pope's order, but the conflict continued. Again he was called to Rome and again approved. For the rest of his life Methodius had to

endure the misunderstanding of the German clergy.

At baptism, Cyril and Methodius received gifts through the power of the Holy Spirit. One of these was courage. It made all the difference in their lives. They are called the "Apostles of the Slavs." Pope John Paul II said that they served as a "spiritual bridge between the Eastern and Western traditions."

St. Cyril and St. Methodius are the Patrons of Europe, Yugoslavia, Bohemia, and Moravia.

St. Cyril and St. Methodius pray for the Slavic people today!

What is the real story of Valentine's Day?

The ancient Romans may also be responsible for the name of our modern day of love. Emperor Claudius II executed two men — both named **Valentine** — on Feb. 14 of different years in the 3rd century A.D. Their martyrdom was honored by the Catholic Church with the celebration of **St. Valentine's Day**.

Reflecting On Sunday's Readings

Someone once stated that, “God is looking for FAT Christians.” For those of us who tend to be a little plump, that was good news. However, the person was not referring to one’s weight but to the characteristics of being Faithful, Available and Teachable. In this week’s Gospel Reading Peter, a rough, simple fisherman seems to have possessed these characteristics. When Jesus showed up with a crowd on the shore where Peter and his partners were working, Peter could have been annoyed by the intrusion; after all he had been up all night working. When Jesus stepped into the empty boat, uninvited, and then asked Peter to move the boat away from the shore a bit, Peter could have simply responded, “Hey! Get out of my boat.” But he didn’t. He, and his possessions, were made available to Jesus. Obviously impressed by Jesus’ teaching he didn’t hesitate to take the boat to deeper water where Jesus told him how to catch some fish. Here was a carpenter, not a fisherman, telling a professional fisherman after a night of fishing failure, how and where to catch fish. Imagine how Peter could have responded! But in humility Peter was not only available to Jesus he was also teachable, responding, “Master, we toiled all night and took nothing! But at your word I will let down the nets.” Jesus’ teachings and demonstrations of power made an astonishing impression on Peter, and standing there in that old fishing boat he experienced an epiphany. Suddenly, he and his partners were conscious of their sinfulness as they became aware of who Jesus is. Consequently, when Jesus said “follow me” they left all and followed Jesus, demonstrating

their faithfulness to respond to the light God gave. Pope John Paul II speaks of this need to be responsive in The Lay Members of Christ’s Faithful People— “Therefore in the life of each member of the lay faithful there are particularly significant and decisive moments for discerning God’s call and embracing the mission entrusted by him. ... No one must forget that the Lord, as the master of the laborers in the vineyard, calls at every hour of life so as to make his holy will more precisely and explicitly known. Therefore, the fundamental and continuous attitude of the disciple should be one of vigilance and a conscious attentiveness to the voice of God.” Like Peter, we are becoming today, what we will be tomorrow. Peter’s later transformation from a tired, smelly, hard working fisherman, into an apostle and leader of the Church did not happen overnight. However, because he made some foundational decisions to be faithful, available and teachable to Jesus on that day he was able to experience future transformation. We may not have Isaiah’s revelation, or Peter’s experience, but we all have occasions where Jesus reveals himself to us to some degree, and we will hear his call to “come follow me.” Perhaps we will even hear it in these passages of Scripture. Will we make ourselves and our possessions available? Will we in humility be teachable and willing to learn? Will we in faithfulness follow? May the answer be, “Yes!”
