FIRST READING

Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

When today's passage from the book of Isaiah was written, the Jewish people had been held in exile in Babylon for more than 40 years. Cyrus, the pagan king of neighboring Persia, was preparing to invade Babylon. The prophet sees Cyrus as an instrument of God. Through the military victory of this pagan king, God will free his people and allow them to return home.

SECOND READING

1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b

Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians is the earliest of all New Testament writings, coming only about 20 years after the Resurrection of Jesus. Today's reading gives us the letter's opening words. In just five verses, we hear reference to God the Father, the Lord Jesus and the Holy Spirit. We also hear reference to faith, hope and love. It indicates how quickly these essentials of our faith became part of our Christian tradition.
