

ASCENSION OF THE LORD THURSDAY, MAY 21, 2020

ANOTHER DRIVE-THRU/IN OPPORTUNITY

It's already been far too long that many of us have felt so distanced from the Lord in not being able to make church visits as a result of having to keep the church doors locked, in order to keep the Coronavirus out; some churches may begin to have their church doors re-opened, so long as they follow the proper protocol of sanitizing the church after people have visited; this will obviously require monitors in the church, and people available to do the sanitizing. In place of having our church doors opened at this time, beginning on Sunday, May 10th, St. Peter's will make Jesus present and visible to his people by placing a Tabernacle containing the Blessed Sacrament in a window of the Friary facing the Meadow Street Parking Lot, awaiting visitors to come and pray and meditate from their cars or from the street. Please feel free to come by St. Peter's, (perhaps while you are out doing your grocery shopping or going to the pharmacy, or simply out for a drive) to make a visit to Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament 24/7 as there will be a light shining on the Tabernacle. The hope is that Jesus' presence and visibility in this way will provide all of us comfort, consolation, and solace during these unprecedented and difficult times.
