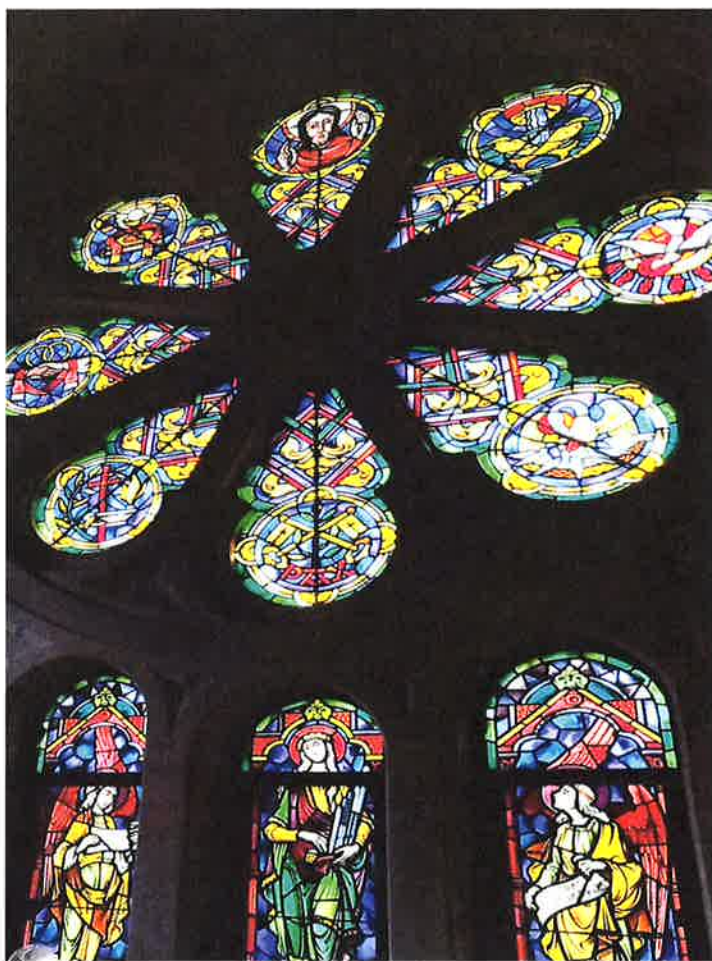

## Reflection from our Seminarian, Matthew Prosperie

In a famous movie, hordes of enemy forces had nearly made it to the innermost of the castle gates. The retreat was sounded for one final stand from the most interior of the castle's fortress. All hope seemed lost for the men, women, and children inside the fortress, and the bravery of the king was unraveling as the last strands of hope frayed in his heart. As fast as his heart was beating with fear, faster were the hammers and axes beating against the door which protected them.

But within the heart of the battered fortress, one soldier had heart enough to hope, and to dare, and to remember. He looked to the king, but the heart of the king had now withered not only to despair, but to speak the words of his despair openly: "So much death.... What can man do against such reckless hate?" He meant not to fight; he had lost his strength of fortitude. Not only his body, but his mind, and his heart, finally, too, were all full of the toxin of hopelessness. And in that moment, as the enemy and their beasts were ready to burst through the door, the brave soldier answered the king's question with four words which were startlingly simple, like the tip of a sword: "Ride out with me."

In stories like this one, hope is always victorious, and I know you'll be happy to hear: this story is no exception. Encouraged by a strong heart that believed, the king's vigor returned, and they did indeed ride out to meet the foe, surprising them, pushing them back, and against all odds, defeating them. It is a beautiful story, full of some of the most human elements there are: hope, despair; bravery and fear; friendship and memory. But, what did the brave soldier remember that sustained this victorious hope? He remembered the words of a powerful friend- words which amounted to a promised arrival at a specific day and time: which happened to be just at *that* moment of greatest need. The sudden arrival of the friend, and the victory it brought, were as great as they were unexpected, and the kingdom lived happily ever after.

Is this story much different than our own? Are we not often overwhelmed by struggles, especially in these days? What is the solution? Retreat back into the fortress of your heart and *remember* God's promise. You and I already do this together at least **every seven days** when we enter the "Castle of God": the **Church**. Do you recognize the words: "Do this in *remembrance* of me"? These words are meant to give us strength to stay faithful to God and to "ride out" from the Church to defeat sin, but first that sin and fear may be defeated in our own hearts. This is a constant battle; let us take comfort that we have a constant, and weekly, chance to be healed, forgiven, and nurtured by the Bread of Life: Jesus, the Son of God, our powerful friend.
