Reflection from our Seminarian, Matthew Prosperie

Is God still providing for us? Bad news can make us second guess. When Jesus heard bad news, what did He do? In today's Gospel, which I'll remind you that "Gospel" means "Good News," Jesus hears the bad news of John the Baptist's murder. Grief must have filled His heart, and the Gospel says that Jesus went by himself to a deserted place. He went there because He knew we would be there one day, too, in the desert of bad news, of grief, of a seemingly God-forsaken land. The desert was where John lived and where people went to find John to hear him preach about God's coming Messiah. As we hear today, the desert will also be where the people will find Jesus Himself. It's also where we will find Him.

What place is barren and empty in your life? Are you craving some good news in the midst of all of this bad news? We are in 2020, but God still meets us in the desert, so do not be afraid to meet Him there, in the very place that seems empty—except for Him! He says to us: "*Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life.*" The crowds were full of life because they followed Jesus who is Life itself. Jesus was only able to multiply the five loaves of bread because the disciples listened to Him and obeyed Him, bringing to Jesus the little, five loaves that they had to offer. Offer Him whatever you have. He says come to me *heedfully* which means that we should not waste time. The crowds wasted no time and made it to Jesus' destination before Him, so that Jesus, as He was just getting out of the boat, saw their vast numbers waiting for Him. Scripture tells us what His response was: "His heart was moved with pity for them." Jesus knows it is hard for us to make the journey into the desert. All the more then, His heart is not simply moved with any old emotion, but with pity, with *compassion* for us. But Jesus does not stop there. No; Scripture says He even cured the sick. When we seek Jesus in the desert, we can be sure He will act with love for us, to cure us of our sin and sickness. But Jesus' compassion is abundant, so He did one more thing, too: He fed them. This miracle overflows to us today, in the Eucharist. After all, what do the twelve baskets of leftover fragments of bread signify? They signify that Jesus performed that miracle not only for those present at that time 2000 years ago, but also for those not present, even up until now. So not only did Jesus go into the desert because He knew we'd be "there" too, but He also multiplied the bread abundantly, so that we would know that He was providing not only for them back then, but also for us today, especially when we receive Him in the Eucharist.
