CHRISTMAS CRECHE: The Christmas Season in the Roman Catholic Church once extended from 24 December, Christmas Eve, through the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, 02 February. The length of the Christmas Season was changed during the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). Today, the Christmas Season ends on the evening of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (12 January in 2020). Many families and parishes choose to keep cherished Christmas customs according to the old liturgical calendar. Visitation Parish families will be able to visit our beautiful nativity scene until 02 February, the former date to end the Christmas Season.

**ORDINARY TIME:** Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, there remain in the yearly cycle those weeks (33 or 34) that do not celebrate a specific mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its fullness. This period is known as Ordinary Time (General Norms 43). Ordinary Time began on Monday

13 January and continues through Tuesday 25 February, the day before Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season. It will resume when the Easter Season ends on Monday 01 June 2019, the day following Pentecost.

**LOVING MOTHER OF THE REDEEMER:** One of the four traditional Marian antiphons, *Alma Redemptoris Mater*, is sung from the First Sunday of Advent until the end of the Christmas season. Hermannus Contractus, a monk of Reichenau (1013-1054) is believed to have composed both the words and the music. At Visitation Parish, a traditional Marian antiphon is sung during the presentation of the gifts.

**USA EMBER DAY OF PRAYER:** All dioceses of the United States will observe a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children on **Wednesday 22 January 2020**, the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision, *Roe vs. Wade* (1973).

**INFANT BAPTISM CLASS:** Parents presenting their children for Baptism must be registered in our parish and are required to attend a Baptism Preparation Class prior to scheduling the Baptism. Throughout this period of preparation, children are to be participating in a formal religious education program in our parish or in a Catholic school.
