# Liturgical Life

SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION: The obligation to return to full in-person participation in the Sunday Eucharist has been re-instated and is currently in effect. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus, another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions.

**WEEKDAY MASS:** Weekday Mass is once again being celebrated in the Thomas More Chapel in the Barn. The time of weekday Mass will remain, at present, at 12 noon.

**ORDINARY TIME:** Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle those weeks (33 or 34) that do not celebrate a specific mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its fullness. This period is known as Ordinary Time (General Norms, 43). Ordinary Time resumed when the Easter Season ended, that is, on Monday, 24 May 2021, the day following Pentecost.

SALVE REGINA: The Marian antiphon, Salve Regina, is sung from Trinity Sunday to the First Sunday of Advent. It was used as a processional chant at Cluny as early as 1135. The text of the antiphon is the familiar prayer, "Hail Holy Queen." At Visitation Parish we use it as a processional chant during the presentation of the gifts.

### **PASTOR'S PAGE**

"For he is our peace...thus establishing peace... He came and preached peace to you who were off And peace to those who were near"

My cell phone is 240-463-9960. Please enter that into your phone for when you need to call or text me. I am here to serve you, and want to be readily available for you and your family. That means 24/7 especially when there is an emergency. Also, in general, I want you to hear the greeting of my voicemail which says "may you know the peace of Christ". It's 15 years old because I've had it my entire priesthood. That's one of the best wishes I could give you. And, I will sign off every time I write here with that phrase.

The lines above from today's second reading (Eph 2:13-18) bring out the importance of the peace of Christ. "He is our peace". When we come to know Christ, we come to know peace. He is Peace itself. None of us knew what peace was until we encountered Christ. "Thus establishing peace". The main purpose of his mission was to bring us Grace. Grace is a share in the life of God. It's a share in the life of the Trinity! Part of that life is peace. So, Christ came to establish peace in us. He didn't come to establish peace between nations as much as to establish peace in the hearts of men.

"He came and preached peace". A big part of my job is to continue the preaching of Jesus Christ. If he preached peace, then I need to preach it. And, often. I need to address it and wish it upon you often in writing and in speech. It will hopefully be talked about much here from the pulpit, in counseling and spiritual direction, and in blessings. One of my great desires as your pastor is that you know and receive the peace of Christ deeply in your souls, hearts and minds.

May you know the peace of Christ.

INFANT BAPTISM: Parents presenting their children for Baptism must be registered in our parish and are required to attend a Baptism Preparation Class prior to scheduling the Baptism. We encourage Sponsors/Godparents, including parishioners who will be Sponsors/Godparents elsewhere, to attend this Baptism Preparation Class. Attendance during pregnancy is advised. For information and/or to register, call the parish office, (301) 948-5536.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION: Following the policy of the Archdiocese of Washington, the Sacramental Programs for Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist and Penance are parish and family based. For youth, Confirmation is a three-year program that begins in the sixth grade; Eucharist/Penance is a two-year program that begins in the first grade. Throughout this period of preparation, children are to be participating in a formal religious education program in our parish or in a Catholic school. Registration in our parish Faith Formation Program is separate from registration in our Sacramental Preparation Program. For information, call the parish office, (301) 948-5536.

# Social Concerns

ADVOCACY REQUESTED BY USCCB: The House Appropriations Committee has drafted its first FY22 appropriations bill that has eliminated provisions designed to prevent taxpayer funds from being used to pay for abortions in the District of Columbia (Dornan Amendment), through foreign assistance (Helms Amendment), and for federal employee health plans that cover abortions. The expectation now is that, as other appropriations bills are released in the coming weeks, the Hyde Amendment and other prolife provisions will also be excluded. Archbishop Naumann, as chairman of the USCCB Committee on Pro-Life Activities, is asking grassroots advocates to

sign their petition at <a href="https://www.notaxpayerabortion.com/">https://www.notaxpayerabortion.com/</a>. The goal is to get millions of Catholics to sign the petition before the full House considers bills during the last two weeks in July.
