Liturgical Life

SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION: The obligation to return to full in-person participation in the Sunday Eucharist has been re-instated and is currently in effect. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe that they were recently exposed to the coronavirus, another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility; or those with serious underlying health conditions.



ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRA- MENT: Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the church on **weekdays**, Monday through Friday, from 11:00 am to Noon.

ORDINARY TIME: Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle those weeks (33 or 34) that do not celebrate a specific mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its fullness. This period is known as Ordinary Time (General Norms, 43). Ordinary Time resumed when the Easter Season ended, that is, on Monday, 24 May 2021, the day following Pentecost.

SALVE REGINA: The Marian antiphon, Salve Regina, is sung from Trinity Sunday to the First Sunday of Advent. It was used as a processional chant at Cluny as early as 1135. The text of the antiphon is the familiar prayer, "Hail Holy Queen." At Visitation Parish we use it as a processional chant during the presentation of the gifts.

PASTOR'S PAGE

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary body and soul into heaven is one of the dogmas of the Church. All Catholics are to believe in the dogmas of the Church, and I have always believed in the Assumption. The part that I might have had wrong until just a few years ago, though, is whether or not Mary actually died. I thought (and taught others) that because Mary never sinned she wouldn't have to endure the main consequence of sin which is death. What I overlooked was that her sinless son died. Whether or not Mary died is not part of the assent we give to the dogma. Some people today believe that Mary died ("fell asleep") before being assumed into heaven. I met some of these people on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2014. One of the places we visited was the Church of Dormition (which means "falling asleep"). This is the site believed to be where Mary died or fell asleep, although our guide said that no one knows definitively.

Now toward the end of the summer season, at a time when fruits are ripe in the gardens and fields, the Church celebrates the most glorious "harvest festival" in the Communion of Saints. Mary, the supremely blessed one among women, Mary, the most precious fruit which has ripened in the fields of God's kingdom, is today taken into the granary of heaven. — Pius Parsch, *The Church's Year of Grace*

...The Assumption is the oldest feast day of Our Lady, but we don't know how it first came to be celebrated (read full article for the history)...

The Assumption completes God's work in her since it was not fitting that the flesh that had given life to God himself should ever undergo corruption. The Assumption is God's crowning of His work as Mary ends her earthly life and enters eternity. The feast turns our eyes in that direction, where we will follow when our earthly life is over.

The feast days of the Church are not just the commemoration of historical events; they do not look only to the past. They look to the present and to the future and give us an insight into our own relationship with God. The Assumption looks to eternity and gives us hope that we, too, will follow Our Lady when our life is ended...

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION: Following the policy of the Archdiocese of Washington, the Sacramental Programs for Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist and Penance are parish and family based. For youth, Confirmation is a three-year program that begins in the sixth grade; Eucharist/Penance is a two-year program that begins in the first grade. Throughout this period of preparation, children are to be participating in a formal religious education program in our parish or in a Catholic school. Registration in our parish Faith Formation Pro-
