

Reflections on Pope Francis Visit

What a wonderful experience of being Catholic this past week has been; overwhelming, but exhilarating! The visit of Pope Francis had a positive impact on both Catholics and non-Catholics alike.

After more than a year of preparation, the Holy Father finally arrived in Washington. His trip was such a kaleidoscope of experiences that it will take a while to sort them out. I will be doing a series of blogs on the pastoral lessons he brought to us.

What struck me most was that he came more as a pastor than as a pontiff or prophet. Of course everything he said was prophetic in nature but not as a command but as an invitation. His speech to the Congress was a pastoral reflection on how to govern. Critics have pointed out that he did not mention the name of Jesus, but the Gospel message was at the heart of his message to the lawmakers of our nation. He spoke of the Gospel values of mercy, compassion for the poor, for migrants and for our common home.

When he spoke to the bishops, his words again were those of a pastor reminding us, his fellow bishops that, “whenever a hand reaches out to do good or to show the love of Christ, to dry a tear or bring comfort to the lonely, to show the way to one who is lost or to console a broken heart ... know that the Pope is at your side and supports you.” Of course, he was being a minister to ministers, something we all must be.

It was amazing how patient people were, hoping to get a glimpse of the Holy Father. People standing for hours in front of the capital, waiting along the street for the Pope in his Pope mobile or black Fiat to pass, and standing in long lines for security checks, all were witnessing to their faith in Jesus Christ and their love of the Holy Father.

I returned on Thursday, so I missed the New York and Philadelphia events, but almost felt as if were there on Sunday afternoon at Klyde Warren Park, where I sat with more than 3,500 people of all ages for the Pope’s final celebration of Mass closing the World Meeting of Families. Surrounded by so many of our local families, young people, seniors, a real Catholic mosaic, I felt a great sense of community and appreciation in being Catholic.

The excitement continued into Monday at the Bishop Farrell Invitational, where 230 generous golfers joined us for a day of fellowship that contributed thousands of dollars to scholarships for students to attend our Catholic schools.

Reflexiones acerca de la visita del Papa Francisco

Qué experiencia tan maravillosa ha sido ser Católico esta semana pasada; ¡abrumadora, pero emocionante! La visita del Papa Francisco tuvo un impacto positivo en Católicos y no Católicos por igual.

Después de más de un año de preparación, el Santo Padre llegó a Washington. Su viaje fue como un caleidoscopio de experiencias que tomará tiempo organizar. Voy a realizar una serie de blogs acerca de las lecciones pastorales que nos trajo.

Lo que más me impactó fue que vino más como pastor que como un pontífice o profeta. Desde luego que todo lo que dijo fue de naturaleza profética, pero no como una orden sino como una invitación. Su discurso ante el Congreso fue una reflexión pastoral acerca de cómo gobernar. Los críticos han señalado que él no mencionó el nombre de Jesús. Sin embargo, el mensaje del Evangelio estuvo al corazón de su mensaje a los legisladores de nuestra nación. Él habló de los valores evangélicos de la misericordia y la compasión por los pobres, los migrantes y nuestra casa común.

Cuando habló a los obispos, sus palabras fueron una vez más las de un pastor recordándonos, a sus hermanos obispos, que “Cuando echan una mano para hacer el bien o llevar al hermano la caridad de Cristo, para enjugar una lágrima o acompañar a quien está solo, para indicar el camino a quien se siente perdido o para fortalecer a quien tiene el corazón destrozado, para socorrer a quien ha caído o enseñar a quien tiene sed de verdad, para perdonar o llevar a un nuevo encuentro con Dios... sepan que el Papa los acompaña y el Papa los ayuda”. Por supuesto, que estaba siendo un ministro a ministros, algo que todos debemos imitar.

Fue increíble la paciencia que tuvo la gente mientras esperaban ver al Santo Padre. Personas de pie durante largas horas frente a la capital, esperando en las calles que el Papa pasara en su papamóvil o Fiat negro y parados en las largas filas de los controles de seguridad, todos fueron testigos de su fe en Jesucristo y su amor por el Santo Padre.

Yo regresé el jueves, por lo que me perdí los eventos de Nueva York y Filadelfia, pero sentí como si estuviera ahí el domingo por la tarde en Klyde Warren Park, donde estuve con más de 3,500 personas de todas las edades para la celebración final del Papa durante la Misa de clausura del Encuentro Mundial de Familias. Rodeado de muchas de nuestras familias, jóvenes y personas de la tercera edad, un verdadero mosaico Católico, sentí un gran sentido de comunidad y agradecimiento de ser Católico. La emoción continuó el lunes en el Obispo Farrell Invitational, donde 230 generosos golfistas se unieron a nosotros en un día de compañerismo que aportó miles de dólares en becas para estudiantes que asisten a nuestras escuelas Católicas.

Sí, realmente todo ha sido una gran bendición para mí. Agradezco a nuestro Padre Celestial por el privilegio de servir como obispo de esta gran diócesis y me siento verdaderamente orgulloso de ser Católico.

October 15th "Feast of St. Teresa of Avila"

Teresa lived in an age of exploration as well as political, social and religious upheaval. It was the 16th century, a time of turmoil and reform. She was born before the Protestant Reformation and died almost 20 years after the closing of the Council of Trent.

The gift of God to Teresa in and through which she became holy and left her mark on the Church and the world is three-fold: She was a woman; she was a contemplative; she was an active reformer.

As a woman, Teresa stood on her own two feet, even in the man's world of her time. She was "her own woman," entering the Carmelites despite strong opposition from her father. She is a person wrapped not so much in silence as in mystery. Beautiful, talented, outgoing, adaptable, affectionate, courageous, enthusiastic, she was totally human. Like Jesus, she was a mystery of paradoxes: wise, yet practical; intelligent, yet much in tune with her experience; a mystic, yet an energetic reformer.

Her writings, especially the Way of Perfection and The Interior Castle, have helped generations of believers.

In 1970, the Church gave her the title she had long held in the popular mind: Doctor of the Church. She and St. Catherine of Siena were the first women so honored.
