- To focus on the 11–18 age range
- To assist young people in the parish to seek a personal encounter with Jesus in their lives, grow in the life of the Spirit and nurture Christian values for the benefit of themselves, their local Church & the wider community
- To empower young people to become visible and active in the Parish

Principal Duties & Responsibilities:

- To organise after-school / evening / weekend events that engage young people
- To provide a link to the Church for those Catholics in the parish who are not attending Catholic schools
- To encourage young people to attend Mass & to support initiatives to reach out to those who
 do not
- To lead Music & Worship within the Youth Group / to grow Youth Music Leaders
- To develop a programme that helps young people to engage in worship within the Parish

- To engage parents and inform and discuss with them the Youth programme
- To develop strong teams through Music / Worship & a range of outdoor activities
- To develop leadership skills amongst young people in the parish, through a range of activities
- To enable young people to play an active & visible role in the life of the parish, promoting a commitment to the Catholic faith
- To be part of the Catechetical Team, with shared responsibility for the delivery of the Confirmation course to young people.
- To have a cultural awareness that values Youth from all backgrounds in the parish
- To promote effective & safe communication on social media platforms
- To promote a safe environment for Parish Youth Ministry through working with PSCs and following the safeguarding policies & practice in the diocese
- To investigate & develop fundraising opportunities, including grants and local parish based initiatives
