All Souls Novena – The bulletin insert lists the loved ones we especially remember during the All Souls Novena Masses. This Novena offers us the opportunity to pray for all the faithful departed, but particularly our parents, relations, friends and benefactors; for those who are most acceptable to God; for those who have suffered the longest, or have the longest yet to suffer; for those who are most forsaken; for those who are nearest redemption; for those who are suffering on our account; for those who hope in our prayers; for those who during life have injured us, or been injured by us.

About the Cover – Depicted on the bulletin cover is the familiar image of the Host and Chalice – very clear symbols of the Eucharistic offering of the Body and Blood of Christ. This imagery appears elsewhere in the church in addition to the two identical tabernacle doors (one shown) on the side altars of St. Patrick Church. Cherubim appear to be holding aloft the Sacred Species amid a floral tribute.

These doors date from the 1909 renovations and were painted gold originally. However, in the 2004 renovations, they were repainted in subdued colors so that these side tabernacles wouldn't compete visually with the main tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament is typically reserved.

Over the course of time as an outgrowth of our 150th anniversary year, we hope to feature other artistic and devotional works within the church that give us a foretaste of heaven.

The Book of the Names of the Dead will be displayed during the month of November near the baptismal font with the burning Easter candle – signs of the Resurrection. You are invited to inscribe the names of your beloved departed in this book. ***Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.***

A Message from Father Hinterschied

Love for holiness and devotion to the saints is so strong in the Church that even the celebration of them “spills” beyond November 1st and well into the first days of this month. For example, many religious orders will celebrate in the days ahead, special feasts specifically to honor the saints of their communities. The same is true, I have learned, of celebrating All Saints of Ireland on the 6th.

Early Irish Martyrologues give basis to devotion to the Irish saints, in fact Saints Patrick, Brigid, and Columba, are saints by local acclaim, well before an official papal canonization process was established. Only four saints, Saints Malachy, Lawrence O’Toole, Oliver Plunkett, and Charles of Mount Argus, have been formally canonized.

In comparison to other countries with strong Catholic heritage, this isn’t many canonizations! Of course, it’s not a contest, yet the numbers are a kind of barometer telling something of the spiritual climate. After all, a vibrant culture will foster holiness. And holiness begets holiness! The death of Irish saints since the Council of Trent points to something amiss, and the same could be argued here in the United States.

A quote from a poem:

Why are saints so difficult to recognize?
 In these days, not like in olden times,
 When we had a resident saint in each oak-grove,
 A holy well in each townland, miracles galore?
 By the law of averages, if, as philosophers maintain,
 And common sense agrees, human nature doesn’t change,
 And we are the mixture as before, there must be
 Saints somewhere, if only we had eyes to see.
