Those who do not wish to participate in the March are welcome to go directly to the State House steps for the remaining portions of the event. There will be a short ceremony on the steps of the State House in recognition of the unborn. We march because we believe in the sanctity of life. We march in remembrance of the millions of unborn babies who were aborted before their birth. And we march in the hope that one day abortion will end. Life face coverings will be provided. We will be following the 6 feet social distancing and the wearing of masks.
