Godparents must submit a copy of their Baptism Certificate at the office if they were baptized outside the parish. A fee of \$25.00 is applicable for Baptisms. Archbishop Peter Hundt will officially open the synod in the Archdiocese of St. John's this Sunday, October 17 with a special 11:00 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral-Basilica of St. John the Baptist which will be live streamed on www.thebasilica.net.

In the coming weeks, the Archdiocese will be inviting responses to an online survey, and also inviting people to participate through various focus groups. The results of the survey and the focus groups will be collated and combined with the results of similar consultations in dioceses across Canada, This combined consultation report will be sent to Rome as a part of the Canadian Church's participation in this first phase of the synod.

Feast of Saint John Paul II ~ October 22nd

Karol Józef Wojtyla, known as John Paul II since his October 1978 election to the papacy, was born in Poland in 1920. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1946 and appointed titular bishop of Ombi and auxiliary of Krakow in 1958 by Pope Pius XII. In 1964, he was appointed Archbishop of Krakow by Pope Paul VI, who made him a cardinal in 1967.

Besides taking part in Vatican Council II (1962-1965) where he made an important contribution to drafting the Constitution *Gaudium et spes*, Cardinal Wojtyla participated in all the assemblies of the Synod of Bishops.

After the death of Pope John Paul I in 1978, the Cardinals elected him Pope at the Conclave of October 16, 1978, and he took the name of John Paul II.

His love for young people brought him to establish the World Youth Days. In 1984, John Paul II became the first pope to step foot on Canadian Soil.

John Paul II's pontificate lasted nearly 27 years. He died on April 2, 2005, the vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday. John Paul II was canonized on April 27, 2014. He is the patron saint of World Youth Day. (Adapted from Living with Christ)
