

Baptism Preparation: A Fee is applicable for a Baptism and must be paid at the Parish Office before the Baptism takes place. Parents and godparents are required to complete a baptism preparation course and therefore must contact the parish office to make arrangements. **Baptism Preparation will be held on May 16th, 2021, at 1:00 p.m., in the Parish Church. To register, contact the parish office at 279-1625.** For Baptism, at least one sponsor (godparent) must be a baptized, confirmed and practicing Roman Catholic. **Godparents must submit a copy of their Baptism Certificate at the Baptism Preparation Course.** Before your child can be baptized, the parish office **must** have a copy of your child's birth certificate. To register, contact the parish office at 279-1625. ***During the COVID-19 Pandemic, baptisms will take place after the 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass.***

REGISTRATION FOR MASS ATTENDANCE: Registration for Mass on a weekly basis is required as we can only accommodate 75 to 80 parishioners. Masks are required to be worn for entry to the Church and must continue to be worn when seated. Any parishioner who has a health issue and cannot wear a mask is asked to contact the Parish Office. **If you are registered and are unable to attend for any reason, please contact the Parish Office and inform them.** These seats would then be available for other parishioners who may not have registered.

6th Sunday of Easter
May 9th, 2021

Today's Gospel follows immediately after the Gospel proclaimed last week, in which Jesus taught that he was the vine and that his disciples were the branches. In the example of the vine and the branches, we learned that our union with Jesus will lead to fruitful service. Today's reading extends this teaching to describe the kind of service that Christians are called upon to offer to others.

This reading, like last week's, is part of Jesus' Last Supper discourse. In the context of John's Gospel, these words are spoken before Jesus' Crucifixion. We read his instruction to the disciples in light of his death and Resurrection. We know that Jesus himself gives us the greatest example of the kind of love and service that he teaches to his disciples. He has, in fact, laid down his life for his friends, for his disciples, and for us. Through his death and Resurrection, we have received the grace to love others as Jesus has commanded.
