

**Baptism Preparation:** A Fee is applicable for a Baptism and must be paid at the Parish Office before the Baptism takes place. Parents and godparents are required to complete a baptism preparation session and therefore must contact the parish office to make arrangements. **The next Baptism Preparation Session will be held on October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2021, at 1:00 p.m., in the Parish Church. To register, contact the parish office at 279-1625.** For Baptism, at least **one** sponsor (godparent) must be a baptized, confirmed and practicing Roman Catholic. **Godparents not baptized in this parish must submit a copy of their Baptismal Certificate at the Baptism Preparation Session.** Before your child can be baptized, the parish office **must** have a copy of your child's birth certificate. ***During the COVID-19 Pandemic, baptisms will take place after the 11:00 a.m. Sunday Mass.***

**REGISTRATION FOR MASS ATTENDANCE:** ***Registration for Mass on a weekly basis is required*** as we can accommodate up to **150** parishioners. Masks are required to be worn at all times. Any parishioner who has a health issue and cannot wear a mask is asked to contact the Parish Office. **If you are registered and are unable to attend for any reason, please contact the Parish Office and inform them.** These seats would then be available for other parishioners who may not have registered.

**REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE COMMITTED OR COVERED UP BY A BISHOP:**

## ***Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels Saturday, October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2021***

The word “angel” comes from the Greek word for messenger, and the Scriptures contain many references to their activities. In the Acts of the Apostles, for example, we read how Peter was assisted by an angel in escaping prison. When he went to a gathering of believers and was announced by the maid, they were incredulous, proclaiming, “It is his angel” (Acts 12.15). It was widely believed that people had a guardian angel assigned by God. In the oldest Roman Sacramentary still in existence, indirect reference is made to these individual guardians in the prayers for the feast. A memorial to guardian angels was entered into the calendar of the Western Church in 1670. *(Taken from Living with Christ)*
