Reflection by Fr. Tom

From 2001 until 2005, I was the pastor of two parishes in Kingston, Jamaica. Several years ago I mentioned to Bishop Leibrecht that the Diocese of Springfield-Cape Girardeau reminded me of the Archdiocese of Kingston. He chuckled and said I had a good imagination but I explained that I saw several points of comparison. For one, both dioceses are predominantly non-Catholic in population with Catholics hovering around 4 to 6 percent. Another is the fact that I see the bishop frequently and he's so readily available! In large metropolitan dioceses, such as Philadelphia and Chicago, bishops have greater difficulty being accessible to their large Catholic populations. Our diocese is truly blest to have both Bishop Rice and Bishop Leibrecht, now retired, on hand for our people. To refer back to Jamaica, one day when I stopped at the Chancery office, Archbishop Clarke's secretary asked me if I could give her a ride home. She was non-Catholic so, on the way, I asked her why many people in Jamaica considered Catholics to be non-Christian. She said, "But you're not! Having worked with the diocese for ten years, I know you pray and you love God but you're not Christian because you don't take up the cross." I protested that we do. She said, "Catholics can do whatever they want to do. They drink, they dance, and they dress any way they want. And if they think they sinned, they just go to confession and then continue doing what they did before. Christians, however, embrace the cross and make hard decisions about how they live their lives." By this time, I had reached her home so I thanked her for her thoughts and left to get back to my parishes. She gave me some insight as to why Jamaicans thought Catholics weren't Christian but she also raised questions for us. Embracing the cross involves more than the issues she mentioned but do we embrace the cross? Seriously, do we really embrace it? "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14: 27).


