TUITION

Homestay Tuition\$45,500

Tuition plans are as follows:

HOME-STAY OPTION 1: Deposit + 2 payments

- February 28, 2020: \$5,000 non-refundable deposit due
- August 3, 2020: \$20,250.00 tuition due
- January 3, 2021: \$20,250.00 tuition due

HOME-STAY OPTION 2: Deposit + 1 payment

- February 28, 2020: \$5,000 non-refundable deposit due
- August 3, 2020: \$40,500 tuition due

SECOND SEMESTER: Students who transfer to SJM during the second semester may pay the semester tuition balance due in a lump sum at \$22,750.00.

WHAT IF A STUDENT WITHDRAWS OR IS DISMISSED?

Students are accepted at San Joaquin Memorial High School with the understanding that they will remain enrolled for the entire semester unless suspended or dismissed. The school's operating budget is based upon projected enrollment and the school's financial obligations do not change when students leave. For extreme hardship cases, determined to be so by the school, tuition may be adjusted according to the policy listed below. **Be sure to consult the Handbook if you are considering withdrawal.**

The date of termination is deemed as the day the Registrar receives written notification from parents or guardians. No adjustment will be made because of late registration, absence from class, leaves of absence, suspension or dismissal of a student, or official school action. Fees and other charges are non-refundable.

EXCEPTIONS

No refund is allowed for any absence or early withdrawal or dismissal due to:

1. The use or possession of alcohol or any drug, narcotic or an agent which is similarly classed or has similar effects unless given by and while under the care and attendance of a legally qualified medical practitioner
2. Actions that would endanger other students, faculty, or staff,
3. Intentionally self-inflicted injuries,
4. Pregnancy, childbirth, or miscarriage

5. Boycotting of classes by the student
6. Insurrection, rebellion, riot, civil commotion, war or act of war, or any governmental order directed to the student,
7. Destruction of any school facility due to any cause whatsoever,
8. Inability of the school to operate and provide formal academic instruction, including closure for any reason, or
9. Being inducted or drafted into the Armed Forces including alternative duty as a conscientious objector.

In addition, no refund is available for reasons such as: a withdrawal or absence from class attendance for the balance of the academic year due to early completion of academic requirements, transferring to another school, early graduation, a student's temporary absence, expulsion or suspension, a change from resident to day status, or returning home for reasons other than medical. **The Head of School reserves the right to determine when and if a refund is owed.**

PLACEMENT DEPOSITS

Returning Students Grades 10 - 12: Tuition and placement deposits: \$5,000 for homestay is due at the time re-registration materials are due. Tuition rates for those student families that do not complete their returning financial paperwork are subject to possible increases.

Incoming Freshmen and Transfer Students Grades 10 - 12: Placement deposit: \$5,000 for homestay along with the Tuition Contract are due within two weeks of receipt of acceptance letter.

***VISA DENIAL**

In the event a student Visa application has been denied by the U.S. Embassy Consulate the applicant must provide that information to the International Student Office at San Joaquin Memorial. Any request for deposit refund due to Visa denial must be requested in writing and provide a copy of the denial letter.

FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

A student is subject to suspension or dismissal at any time if the family's tuition account is delinquent or if any payments are deferred without authorization. A diploma will not be awarded until financial accounts and other obligations are paid.
