PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Church Family,

Since last weekend, a number of you have requested my sermon, Dream and Dream Big. I am happy to provide my research notes since I do not have the sermon verbatim.

It has been fifty years since the assassination of Dr. King and if he had lived this would have been his eighty-ninth birthday. For the past fifty years we as a people, nation and a world have been deprived of the wisdom, vision and dreams of this great prophet. So, my sermon is entitled: "Dream and Dream BIG!"

Dr. King was a pastor, a prophet and a dreamer. We thank God for him and we are encouraged to follow his example of dreaming big for the betterment of the world and the building of God's Kingdom.

One of the Bible's greatest dreamers was Joseph, whose brothers sold him into slavery in Egypt, and said to each other, "Here comes that dreamer. Come now, let's kill him and throw him into one of these cisterns. Then we'll see what comes of his dreams." (Genesis 37:19) They don't kill him, but they do sell him into slavery in Egypt where his dreams allow him to rise to the office of governor of that country and in turn save both Egypt and his own people from famine. Joseph was a big dreamer and so was Samuel, the great judge over Israel, who received God's call in his life through a dream.

Reflecting on the power and importance of dreams, Dr. Howard Thurman wrote: "The dream in the heart is the outlet. It is one with the living water welling up from the very springs of being, nourishing and sustaining all of life. Where there is no dream, life becomes a swamp, a dreary dead place and deep within, a person's heart begins to rot. Keep alive the dream; for as long as you have a dream in your heart you cannot lose the significance of living."

Dr. King reminded us, "No person has the right to rain on your dreams." There could be no better message for us as we remember, honor and celebrate Dr. King than, "Let's dream and dream Big." Let us learn and testify to the necessity of holding fast to our dreams and teaching our children the importance living the dream, the importance of witnessing to the power of God's vision of a world renewed, reborn and recreated in peace, love and mercy.

So, dream and dream big!
