Message For Easter 2020

Dear Church Family,

Lent, Holy Week, and now Easter! Although we may be physically quarantined, we are spiritually connected. The social distancing we are practicing can never distance us from the Lord. The reality of Covid-19, or anything else, will never deny nor diminish the great Love of God for us. So, let's not allow this pandemic to distract us from our faith in the risen Lord, and our trust in God's providence!

I invite you to focus on these three things as we celebrate Easter 2020—the CROSS, the GRAVE and the STONE.

The CROSS and its impact- Jesus' death on the cross gave new value and meaning to what had been an instrument of torture used to execute criminals and traitors. Since the Crucifixion of Jesus, the cross appears everywhere- in earrings, necklaces, and is a most popular tattoo.

The meaning of the cross is profound. The cross of Christ was a stunning declaration of unconditional love, the ultimate sacrifice, and the victory over sin, death and the devil.

Look at the words from the old hymn, *At The Cross*:

*There's a place where mercy
Reigns and never dies.
There's a place where streams
Of grace flow deep and wide.
Where all the love I've ever found
Comes like a flood, comes flowing down.*

The TOMB- The tomb is important because it is where we place the dead, and Jesus was dead. The tomb is where the dead Jesus underwent a transformation, for when we encounter the resurrected Jesus, we discover that he is not just alive with a body, but with a glorified, otherworldly body—Jesus was alive in a new way beyond the limits of time and space.

The STONE- Matthew, in his Gospel paints this picture "... an angel of the Lord came and rolled back the stone and sat on it." Can you hear that angel laughing, "Do you see this stone? This great stone not only closed the tomb. but it was later sealed by the soldiers. The stone, and the seal on it, was a sign of the finality and the power of death. But look, the stone is moved away, the angel is sitting on it and the tomb is empty.

The angle wants us to see that the very stone that sealed death had been rolled away, turned over, transformed into a pulpit for proclaiming the miracle and mystery of the Resurrection. Alleluia! This Jesus is not a past memory but a Real Presence, a presence which continues to transform the forces of death all around us today. Remember the cross, the grave and the stone.

For those who are “tech savvy”, you may self-register for “Flock Notes” by following these easy steps:

- 1. Go to your cell phone and create a new text message.*
- 2. Put 84576 in the field.*
- 3. Put stm4265 (all lower case) in the body of text.*
- 4. Hit “Send.”*
- 5. Click the link in the reply message*
- 6. Complete the name page, hit save.*
- 7. Choose your groups, hit next*
- 8. Complete the rest of the fields, hit save.*
- 9. You will receive an email to verify your email address, click verify my email*
- 10. You will receive another email to create a password, click create password*
- 11. Once your password is set it will log you into Flock Notes.*
