**~PASTOR'S PEN~
FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER**

STM Family,

We continue our journey from Easter to Pentecost. Today is the twenty-second day of Easter. That means that there are twenty-eight days to Pentecost 2021 on May 23rd. We also refer to this Fourth Sunday of Easter as "Good Shepherd Sunday." Jesus is our Good Shepherd who leads us through the dark valleys of life whose "goodness and kindness follow us all the days of our lives."

This Sunday's Gospel presents us with one of the most popular and well-known images of our Savior, our Good Shepherd. He says "I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep." And that is exactly what Jesus did for each of us.

We find a powerful and poignant description of the "good shepherd" in the Old Testament book of I Samuel. King Saul is attempting to dissuade the young shepherd, David, from fighting against the powerful Philistine warrior, Goliath. The young David stands his ground and argues his case with Saul in these very graphic terms—describing how he shepherded his father's sheep—"Whenever a lion or a bear came to carry off a sheep from the flock, I would chase after it and attack it, and snatch the prey from its mouth. If it attacked me, I would seize it by the throat, strike it and kill it...the same Lord who delivered me from the claws of the lion and the bear will deliver me from the hand of the Philistine."

As our Good Shepherd, Jesus fights for us, saves us from the gaping jaws of whatever or whoever seeks to grab and destroy our discipleship and wound the "little flock" of the Church. He shepherds us with loving care so that we may "have life and have it more abundantly."

In contrast to the Good Shepherd is the hireling who is concerned with his own self-interests: his profit, popularity, and position. Often in the words of the prophets (Ezekiel, Isaiah and Jeremiah) God has denounced the shepherd leaders of Israel who had sold out their stewardship and good shepherding. "I myself will pasture my sheep," he says. There are still political, social and even religious "hirelings" in our world today. But there are also great shepherds who are willing to lay down their lives for their sheep.

The Parable of the Good Shepherd is powerfully encouraging for us today. We find insight into Jesus' dream of how the world might be. While the wolf attacks the flock "in order to catch and scatter," Jesus is the shepherd who tends the flock, leads the sheep but also gathers those who are lost and searches for those who are scattered. As our Good Shepherd, Jesus is doing the Father's will, who desires that all should be found, welcomed, cherished, and loved in the family of God.

Please pray the Pentecost Empowerment Prayer each day through Pentecost:

Loving Lord,

here I am, just as I am.

I trust that you have incredible plans for me.

So, transform me. Empower me. Use me!

Everything is on the table.

Take what you want to take.

And give what you want to give

so that I can live the life you envision for me.

I hold nothing back.

I am 100% available.

So, dear God, send your Holy Spirit upon me

that I may build your Kingdom in my words and work.

Through Christ our Lord. AMEN!
