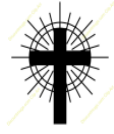
Our weekly Adult Bible Study will be on summer break until the fall.

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

STM Family,

“There is a boy who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good is that for so many?” These words we read from today’s gospel. The disciples begin this passage from John’s Gospel focused on the scarcity of resources at hand to satisfy the hunger of the large crowd that has followed Jesus up the mountain. They discount the five loaves and two fish as worthless in the face of overwhelming need in front of them. However, we must be prepared for the miracle of God, who can make much out of so little, so much so that what began as so little becomes abundantly more because the disciples trusted in God’s providence. *Here are some things to consider as we reflect on these scriptures:* In both our first reading from 2 Kings and the Gospel of John, the people eat their fill and there is some left over. When have you experienced the abundant generosity of God?

In Psalm 145, we read, “Let all your works give you thanks, O Lord, and let your faithful ones bless you.” How do you keep gratitude and thanksgiving central in your prayers?

St. Paul instructs the Ephesians to live lives characterized by humility, gentleness, and patience. Which of these is most difficult for you to practice?

In the Gospel of John, Jesus makes himself known through “signs.” What does the sign of the feeding of the five thousand tell us about who Jesus is?
