## ~PASTOR'S PEN~

### Twenty-Second Sunday In Ordinary Time

#### STM Family,

For the next few weeks we will hear from the Epistle of James. James teaches us many valuable lessons. He tells us, "Be doers of the word and not hearers only. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world."

Many years after James wrote his letter, St. Francis of Assisi famously would say, "Preach the gospel at all times, and if necessary, use words". While our call to proclaim the gospel definitely requires us to use words, this quote—and James' injunction—reminds us that our words mean nothing if they are not supported and lived out in our actions. It is not enough to hear the word of God and go through the motions of our rituals on Sunday morning. We must allow these words to become fully rooted in our compassionate service to others; when we do this our entire lives change. We become more loving, more giving, more humble, more Christian.

This week let us consider, how do we receive the word of the Lord as the greatest gift of our lives? And, after receiving the gift, how do we strive to put the gospel message into action in all that we do and say?

Pope Francis writes in *Fratelli Tutti (On Fraternity and Social Friendship)* the following:

"Human beings are so made that they cannot live, develop and find fulfillment except 'in the sincere gift of self to others.'" "Nor can they fully know themselves apart from an encounter with other persons: 'No one can experience the true beauty of life without relating to others, without having real faces to love.' This is part of the mystery of authentic human existence." 'Life exists where there is bonding, community, fraternity; and life is stronger than death when it is built on true relationships and bonds of fidelity.' On the contrary, there is no life when we claim to be self-sufficient and live as islands: in these attitudes, death prevails."

So, this week, let our deeds confirm and testify to the faith we confess in our thoughts, words, and worship. Let us also be attentive to the needs of our sisters and brothers who are suffering in this world—those in Haiti and Afghanistan, those challenged everywhere with Covid-19.
