~PASTOR'S PEN~

Twenty-Fourth Sunday In Ordinary Time

STM Family,

Once again this week we find ourselves challenged by our scriptures, especially the Letter of James. Thus far over the two weeks, James has exhorted us:

1. Humbly welcome the word that has been planted in you and is able to save you. ...Be doers of the word not just hearers. ...Religion that is pure and undefiled is this: to care for orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained by the world.
2. My brothers and sisters, show no partiality as you adhere to the faith in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ. ...Did not God choose those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the Kingdom that he promised to those who love him?

Today's instruction contrasts faith without works: "...if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him?" And "Faith without works is dead."

Once again, our beliefs, words and best intentions come together at the point of intersection with our good works and our faith. We must put into concrete actions the faith that we profess. Thus, faith becomes real, meaningful, and lifegiving when we practice what we profess.

Taking these scriptures to heart and putting faith in action is what Pope Francis teaches us in the encyclical, *Fratelli Tutti* (On Fraternity and Social Friendship):

"At a time when everything seems to disintegrate and lose consistency, it is good for us to appeal to the 'solidarity' born of consciousness that we are responsible for the fragility of others as we strive to build a common future. Solidarity finds concrete expression in service, which can take a variety of forms in an effort to care for others. And service in great part means 'caring for the vulnerable, the vulnerable members of our families, our society, our people.' In offering such service, individuals learn to 'set aside their own wishes and desires, their pursuit of power, before the concrete gaze of those who are most vulnerable. Service always looks to their faces, touches their flesh, senses their closeness and tries to help them.' Service is never ideological, for we do not serve ideas, we serve people."

Some questions for reflection:

1. The prophet Isaiah writes, "The Lord is my help/therefore I am not disgraced." When has your faith helped you to stand firm in the face of adversity and derision?
2. St. James reminds us, "Faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." How do you put your faith to work each day?
3. We encounter Jesus' question to the disciples: "But who do you say that I am?" At this moment in your faith journey, how would you answer this question?
