Thirtieth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family,

Let me reflect this week on the topic servant/leadership and our invitation by Jesus to lead as servants who willingly sacrifice for others. Last Sunday's gospel focused on the Apostle-brothers James and John and their determination to hold the top positions among the other ten Apostles. Were they over zealous or over ambitious? Were they seeking position and prestige and power? Or might they have just been trying to be the very best leaders of the Kingdom of God.

Let's look at servant-leadership as it applies to us today. All of us are called to servant-leadership in our roles as Christian women and men who are husbands and wives, mothers and fathers, sisters and brothers, participants in our ministries and church organizations. From the Second Vatican Council we know that the lay members of the Church are called to lead in the world by sanctifying it.

As we *Take The Next Step* in reconnecting and recommitting to our church, let me share the following reflection. Jim Hunter, writing *Servant Leadership*, has this to say on this topic. "A lot of times people associate leadership with being the person who is in charge, or somebody who is a good manager. And really, leadership is more about being a person of "influence." Leadership is a skill, that's a learned or acquired ability. It's not something you're a born with. But it's the ability to be able to inspire and influence people to action, the ability to get the fire going within somebody. So, leadership is about inspiring and influencing people to action.

Now to the servant part—it's not about being a slave. Being a servant leader is not about doing what people want. **It's about doing what people need, and there is a huge difference.**

So what servant leaders are about is the business of identifying and meeting people's needs, seeking their greatest good so that they can grow. Here are questions about effective servant leadership:

Do people leave you better than they found you?

Do you leave things better than you found them?

So, am I going to grow as a result of being under your leadership?

Finally, I want to thank you for supporting "**Take The Next Step**" in your personal stewardship of sacrifice and service. May the Lord bless us all with His amazing and abundant grace.
