Cold & Flu Season

In response to the cold & flu season and the spread of the Coronavirus, the Diocese has asked us to take the following precautions:

In general, be vigilant in monitoring your health. If you are ill, refrain from coming to Mass. The obligation to attend Sunday Mass is lifted when one is ill. (You can also request that your priest bring Holy Communion to you at home).

We will exchange the Sign of Peace through a smile, a nod of the head, or similar gesture instead of a handshake. This will be temporary.

Also, the Precious Blood will still be offered from the chalice, but we ask those who are sick to refrain from receiving in this way. We receive the fullness of Christ's Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, even when only receiving the Sacred Host.

Catechism Corner

What is the Sacrament Called? (Continued)
1330 The **memorial** of the Lord's Passion and Resurrection.

The **Holy Sacrifice**, because it makes present the one sacrifice of Christ the Savior and includes the Church's offering. The terms **holy sacrifice of the Mass**, "**sacrifice of praise**," **spiritual sacrifice**, **pure and holy sacrifice** are also used, since it completes and surpasses all the sacrifices of the Old Covenant. **The Holy and Divine Liturgy**, because the Church's whole liturgy finds its center and most intense expression in the celebration of this sacrament; in the same sense we also call its celebration the **Sacred Mysteries**. We speak of the **Most Blessed Sacrament** because it is the Sacrament of sacraments. The Eucharistic species reserved in the tabernacle are designated by this same name.

1331 **Holy Communion**, because by this sacrament we unite ourselves to Christ, who makes us sharers in his Body and Blood to form a single body. We also call it: **the holy things (ta hagia; sancta)**—the first meaning of the phrase "communion of saints" in the Apostles' Creed—**the bread of angels, bread from heaven, medicine of immortality, viaticum...**

1332 **Holy Mass (Missa)**, because the liturgy in which the mystery of salvation is accomplished concludes with the sending forth (missio) of the faithful, so that they may fulfill God's will in their daily lives.
