May God bless you during this Sacred Paschal Triduum, the holiest days of the Church's year. Even though it's painful that we cannot gather to celebrate these liturgies together in person, we are still able to be united in prayer during these days.

I will be joining the priests at Corpus Christi Parish in St. Johnsbury for these three days of the Triduum, where they plan to live-stream these liturgies. Their schedule is as follows: Holy Thursday 4/9/20 at 7 p.m., Good Friday 4/10/20 at 3:30 p.m., & the Easter Vigil 4/11/20 at 8 p.m. Barring any technical difficulties, you should be able to watch these liturgies in real time by following one of these two links:

Even if none of these options work for you, you can still join us in prayer on these three holy days by setting aside time to meditate on the Scriptures, especially the readings of the day, or the Gospel accounts of Christ's passion and resurrection. You can also pray the Rosary, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, or another devotions. Let us all offer up our prayers and sacrifices for the healing of everyone afflicted with the coronavirus, for the safety of the doctors and nurses treating them, and for a speedy end to this pandemic. On Easter, we celebrate Jesus' victory over sin, death, and all the powers of darkness. May He help us to share in the joy of His victory during these difficult days.

### Catechism Corner

#### The institution of the Eucharist (continued)

“Do this in memory of me”

1341 The command of Jesus to repeat his actions and words "until he comes" does not only ask us to remember Jesus and what he did. It is directed at the liturgical celebration, by the apostles and their successors, of the memorial of Christ, of his life, of his death, of his Resurrection, and of his intercession in the presence of the Father.

1342 From the beginning the Church has been faithful to the Lord's command. of the Church of Jerusalem it is written:

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.... Day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they partook of food with glad and generous hearts.

The Word and the Bread of the Eucharist, the mystery and the gift of Easter, remain down the centuries as a constant memorial of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ!

Stay with us, faithful friend and sure support for humanity on its journey through history! Living Word of the Father, give hope and trust to all who are searching for the true meaning of their lives. Bread of eternal life, nourish those who hunger for truth, freedom, justice and peace.

Stay with us, Living Word of the Father, and teach us words and deeds of peace: peace for our world consecrated by your blood and drenched in the blood of so many innocent victims:

peace for the countries of the Middle East and Africa, where so much blood continues to be shed; peace for all of humanity, still threatened by fratricidal wars. Stay with us, Bread of eternal life, broken and distributed to those at table: give also to us the strength to show generous solidarity towards the multitudes who are even today suffering and dying from poverty and hunger, decimated by fatal epidemics or devastated by immense natural disasters. By the power of your Resurrection, may they too become sharers in new life...
