Letter From Fr. Curtis

Dear Parishioners,

I hope and pray that you are doing as well as you can during these hard times. If you are in need of assistance, please don't hesitate to call me at the rectory. I'll do what I can. Here at the rectory, our parish food shelf is well-stocked thanks to many generous parishioners. Thank you! Also, the Vermont Foodbank and the Vermont National Guard will be distributing MREs (Meals Ready to Eat) on Wednesday, April 29, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the Northeast Kingdom International Airport, 2628 Airport Road, Newport.

This Tuesday, April 28 is St. Louis de Montfort's day. This French priest wrote a book called *True Devotion to Mary* about how we can grow closer to Jesus through devotion to His Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Appropriately, this coming month of May is specially devoted to Mary. It's traditional to crown Mary's statue during May. Since we are not able to gather to do this together at Mass, if you have a statue of Mary at home, you can make a crown for it, or set out flowers in front of it. If you have children, this would be a good activity to do with them. You can also try to pray the Rosary more often and regularly. If you need a guide for how to pray the Rosary, let me know, and I'll send you one.

We commemorate a few other saints this week, including the Italian mystic St. Catherine of Siena on Wednesday, April 29, and St. Joseph the Worker on Friday, May 1. On St. Joseph's day, let's contemplate how he offered his labors to provide for the Holy Family of Jesus and Mary, and remember to pray for families that are stressed about work or out of work at this time.

Catechism Corner

Catechism on the Eucharist
(continued)

1343 It was above all on “the first day of the week,” Sunday, the day of Jesus’ resurrection, that the Christians met “to break bread.” From that time on down to our own day the celebration of the Eucharist has been continued so that today we encounter it everywhere in the Church with the same fundamental structure. It remains the center of the Church’s life.

1344 Thus from celebration to celebration, as they proclaim the Paschal mystery of Jesus “until he comes,” the pilgrim People of God advances, “following the narrow way of the cross,” toward the heavenly banquet, when all the elect will be seated at the table of the kingdom.
