Letter From Fr. Curtis

Dear Parishioners,

Several months ago, I mentioned that the Diocese was about to begin a capital campaign. The pandemic put everything on hold, but the Diocese is now resuming the capital campaign. If you haven't already, you will likely be receiving information about this campaign in the mail soon. I know that this is a hard time financially for many of our parishioners and families. Our expectations for this campaign are more modest given the challenging time we are enduring. If you are able to donate, I would encourage you to prayerfully consider making a contribution.

Of the funds we raise, if we meet our goal, 60% will stay in our parish, while 40% goes to the Diocese, of which 20% goes to support Catholic education and 20% goes to support Vermont Catholic Charities. Even this 40% that goes to the Diocese will benefit us because it will help support our own St. Paul's Catholic School and the many parishioners and other people in our communities who receive aid from Catholic Charities.

In addition to this three-year capital campaign, the Diocese is still running the Bishop's Fund annual appeal. This supports the Diocese's year-to-year expenses, while the capital campaign is about raising funds for the future.

Again, I would like to stress that if you are enduring financial hardship at this time, you do not have to support these initiatives. I know that you support our parish in many ways, through prayer, volunteering, and by witnessing to our faith in Christ throughout our community. I appreciate that greatly. If you are in a place of financial stability though, I would encourage you to consider donating to the Bishop's Fund and the capital campaign. Your donation will help our parish and Diocese into the future.

Our faith is not about raising money, however. It is about worshiping God, following the teachings of Jesus, and serving each other. If we are able to do these things, then we are on the right path.

The sacrificial memorial of Christ and of his Body, the Church continued

1369 The whole Church is united with the offering and intercession of Christ. Since he has the ministry of Peter in the Church, the Pope is associated with every celebration of the Eucharist, wherein he is named as the sign and servant of the unity of the universal Church. The bishop of the place is always responsible for the Eucharist, even when a priest presides; the bishop's name is mentioned to signify his presidency over the particular Church, in the midst of his presbyterium and with the assistance of deacons. The community intercedes also for all ministers who, for it and with it, offer the Eucharistic sacrifice:

Let only that Eucharist be regarded as legitimate, which is celebrated under [the presidency of] the bishop or him to whom he has entrusted it.¹⁹¹ Through the ministry of priests the spiritual sacrifice of the faithful is completed in union with the sacrifice of Christ the only Mediator, which in the Eucharist is offered through the priests' hands in the name of the whole Church in an unbloody and sacramental manner until the Lord himself comes.

1370 To the offering of Christ are united not only the members still here on earth, but also those already in the glory of heaven. In communion with and commemorating the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints, the Church offers the Eucharistic sacrifice. In the Eucharist the Church is as it were at the foot of the cross with Mary, united with the offering and intercession of Christ.


