Letter From Fr. Curtis

Dear Parishioners,

This Tuesday, August 4, is the feast day of St. John Vianney, patron of our church in Irasburg and of parish priests. He was a priest who lived in France during the turbulent decades after the French Revolution. St. John had a difficult time with his studies for the priesthood, but he persisted and became a holy and dedicated parish priest in the small village of Ars, France. He was especially dedicated to the Eucharist and spending many hours each day hearing Confessions. St. John had many wise insights into the spiritual life, a few of which I have included below:

-There is nothing so great as the Eucharist. If God had something more precious, He would have given it to us.

-Do not try to please everybody. Try to please God, the angels, and the saints – they are your public.

-If people would do for God what they do for the world, what a great number of Christians would go to Heaven.

-God commands you to pray, but He forbids you to worry.

The presence of Christ by the power of his word and the Holy Spirit

1373 “Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us,” is present in many ways to his Church: in his word, in his Church’s prayer, “where two or three are gathered in my name,” in the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned, in the sacraments of which he is the author, in the sacrifice of the Mass, and in the person of the minister. But “he is present ... most especially in the Eucharistic species.”

1374 The mode of Christ’s presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as “the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend.” In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist “the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained.” “This presence is called ‘real’—by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be ‘real’ too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present.”
