Letter From Fr. Curtis

Dear Parishioners,

For the past couple years, our parish has been blessed to have Kayla Poginy serve as our Director of Religious Education. Now she will be moving on from this position as she pursues opportunities elsewhere. We thank Kayla for her hard work and dedication here, and we wish her well in her future endeavors. Thank you, Kayla!

Our plan is to share a Director of Religious Education with our two neighboring parishes: Mater Dei in Newport and St. Andre Bessette in Troy. We are currently interviewing a possible candidate.

This weekend, we will have a chicken barbecue following the 10:30 Mass at St. Paul's. All are welcome.

The Bishop's Fund Annual Appeal is still ongoing. Our parish has raised \$14,868, which is 65% of our goal. Thank you for your support, especially during these difficult times.

We are also officially launching the Diocesan Capital Campaign, Christ Our Hope this weekend. Some have asked why we have both the Bishop's Fund and the Capital Campaign at the same time. That's a good question. The Bishop's Fund is an annual appeal that supports the yearly expenses of the Diocese, among other things. The Capital Campaign is a unique, three-year long program to raise funds for our parish and the Diocese. If we reach our parish goal of \$142,231, we will keep 60% in our parish, and 40% will go to support the Diocese, particularly Vermont Catholic Charities and Catholic education and formation. Even those funds that go to the Diocese will support many in our community because we utilize funds from Catholic Charities and St. Paul's Catholic School benefits from Diocesan support. I will provide more information on the Capital Campaign at the Masses this weekend. If you'd like to volunteer to help with this campaign, please let me know.
