Letter From Fr. Curtis

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you all for your prayers for my health. I am feeling better, but I'm still taking it easy as I continue to recover. I don't have anything contagious, but I'm still dealing with a digestive issue. Thanks for your continued prayers.

You will notice that we have special "angel trees" set up at all three of our churches. The trees are decorated with tags listing gifts requested by the 32 residents of Michaud Manor, the Diocese's residential care home in Derby. Please consider taking a tag and buying a gift for one of the residents. You can return these items to church or the rectory porch during the next three weekends, but we will need them by the weekend of December 12-13 to deliver them in time for Christmas. Please attach the tags to your unwrapped gifts. See the bulletin insert for more information. Thank you to Karen Jarvis for organizing this! Please contact her if you have any questions.

Finally, with the increasing number of coronavirus cases in our state and local communities, Bishop Coyne has implemented a couple new rules. First, let me stress that the Bishop's goal is to try to keep us healthy and to keep our churches open as long as possible. Following these rules helps us meet these goals. Disregarding them could lead to people getting sick and our churches being closed to the public.

Starting this weekend, everyone attending weekend Masses (except children under 2) will be required to wear a mask. For those unable to attend Mass for health reasons or unwilling to follow these rules, the Bishop has lifted the obligation to attend Mass at this time.

Starting next weekend, November 28-29, we will have sign-in sheets for weekend Masses. We ask people to write their name (or the name of their family), the number of people attending, and a contact phone number or email address. We will keep these lists at the parish for 30 days before shredding them. We will only share them with the state if there is an outbreak directly linked to a particular Mass.

The Bishop emphasizes that these rules are not to be construed as a political statement in any way. They are precautions strongly recommended by doctors and other healthcare professionals.

THE EUCHARIST—“PLEDGE OF THE GLORY TO COME” (continued)

1403 At the Last Supper the Lord himself directed his disciples' attention toward the fulfillment of the Passover in the kingdom of God: "I tell you I shall not drink again of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom." Whenever the Church celebrates the Eucharist she remembers this promise and turns her gaze "to him who is to come." In her prayer she calls for his coming: "Marana tha!" "Come, Lord Jesus!" "May your grace come and this world pass away!"

1404 The Church knows that the Lord comes even now in his Eucharist and that he is there in our midst. However, his presence is veiled. Therefore we celebrate the Eucharist "awaiting the blessed hope and the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ," asking "to share in your glory when every tear will be wiped away. On that day we shall see you, our God, as you are. We shall become like you and praise you for ever through Christ our Lord."

I wish to thank all brother knights who participated in selling Turkey Raffle tickets and especially everyone who supported our Council by buying tickets.

It was a great success and with many happy winners.
