
Weekly Contributions

Bishop Cahill has extended the dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation through the **end of July** so that those who are most vulnerable/weak--or simply concerned due to the Pandemic in general--may continue to do so absent the concern about not properly honoring or keeping the Sabbath Day. The parish continues to livestream the Mass each weekend for those who would like to maintain a connection with their "familiar" spiritual surroundings.
