Home-Based CCD Faith Formation

The materials for the home-based instruction are ordered. As soon as they arrive those registered will be able to pick them up. The program comes with an included internet/digital option for those who would like to utilize it. The program is not a book--it's a weekly lesson based on a scriptural connection to Sunday Mass. It comes bilingual--which will be helpful for those Spanish-speaking parents wanting to be involved and engaged in the weekly lesson. The packet covers a period of weeks. When the next packet arrives then the families pick them up and continue.

Rosary Congress

Some may recall last year's diocesan rosary congress...which offered an opportunity to deepen faith and reconnect with the "basics." This year the entire diocese will again observe a week-long rosary congress--adapted with pandemic restrictions. Parishioners are encouraged to pray the rosary--when possible in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

There will be an opening Mass at the Cathedral on Sunday, October 4th at 6 pm. The following week parishes throughout the diocese will offer opportunities for Eucharistic Adoration where adorers are asked to pray the rosary each hour. The four intentions of this year's rosary congress are: 1) for an end to the coronavirus pandemic; 2) for hope, care, and the safety of our families; 3) in reparation for the sin of indifference to the pain of others; and 4) in reparation for the sins of priests and bishops in the scandals of the Church. The closing weekend of the congress, October 10/11, the Masses will have special readings and prayers taken from the Votive Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary (lectors and musicians should plan accordingly and check with the parish office for the readings).

During these past months we have not had our regular monthly Adoration. The Rosary Congress offers us a chance to resume Eucharistic Adoration. Our plan is to have Exposition after the 6:30 am Mass on Thursday, October 8th and then conclude with devotions to the Blessed Mother and Benediction at 6:10 am on Friday, October 9th in Church. We need those who normally come to our 24 Hours of Eucharistic Adoration to verify with us if they will be open to resuming on this special occasion--allowing us to plan for finding replacements for those unsure or concerned. Please call or email the parish office by Monday, September 28th to inform. The Catholic Daughters are going to organize our attempt at return to Eucharistic Adoration. Adorers are asked to contact the office or the CDA regent, Georgia Kutach, if they are ready and/or willing to assist.

This year's Rosary Congress will also include the introduction of a Marian Consecration. There will be a virtual presentation through the diocesan website on Wednesday, October 7th, and the Marian Consecration preparation will begin Monday, October 19th, with the actual consecration on Sunday, November 21st.


A Day of Prayer and Fasting
