## World Mission Sunday

This weekend's second collection supports Catholic World Missions. By Baptism, all Catholics are called to participate in the mission of the Church and share their faith as missionaries. World Mission Sunday gathers support for the pastoral and evangelization programs and needs of more than 1,150 mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands, and remote regions of Latin America. The funds gathered on World Mission Sunday are distributed in the pope's name by the Society for the Propagation of Faith – a Pontifical Mission Society.

## Planning Ahead: 2022

The opening of the 2022 calendar will be Monday, **November 1<sup>st</sup>**. Parishioners will be allowed to schedule **ONE Sunday Mass and ONE weekday Mass**. There is the possibility of combined intentions (where two families want a specific day - and they both agree to combining and then both intentions are listed). Even reducing the number to one each will still not open up the calendar greatly. So as to assist the number of weekends not being filled up so quickly--only ONE weekend Mass may be scheduled for a particular individual. Those who simply want to arrange for Masses (to be scheduled according to dates remaining open) may do so respecting a limit of ten. Near the end of 2022 those extra Masses not scheduled (due to lack of available dates) will be sent to the diocese where they are distributed to priests/parishes that do not have a surplus of intentions and where there are openings. This provides that Masses requested will be celebrated within a year. It's understood that this is not ideal--it's just dealing with the reality of everyone wanting weekends and finding ways to accommodate as many parishioner requests as possible. Recall that each weekend--of the four Masses--church law requires one Mass must be celebrated For the Parish Family. So, practically speaking, the parish has four weekend Masses (5pm, 7am, 9am, and 11am) and one of those four will always be set aside For the Parish Family.

As the new year calendar opens in November for Mass Intentions, the calendar will open for Sanctuary Candle Intentions as well. The offering covers the cost of the 51% beeswax candle that burns in the Church near the tabernacle. Just as we have a tradition of lighting vigil candles for special intentions, the sanctuary candle offering provides for the expense of this special candle that burns as a reminder Jesus is present in the tabernacle. A year allows for a possibility of approximately 52 weeks of Lamp Intentions. Again, with the limitation of time available and number of requests, the Sanctuary Candle Intention can be scheduled for **ONE** week for a particular person. To be noted is the reality that we actually have two sanctuary candles burning – one here and one at St. Ann. So as to allow more to utilize this much requested memorial – both candles will be available for sponsoring.

## New Film on Purgatory

People have been wondering what awaits them after death since the beginning of time. And although much remains a secret, there have been many people through the ages who could see more – like Fulla Horak, St. Faustina Kowalska or St. Padre Pio. These mystics – people who have been graced by the visits of souls from Purgatory – are only some of the protagonists of the Michal Kondrat film which is scheduled for theatrical release October 25<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>.

The new film from the creator of “Love and Mercy: Faustina” and “Two Crowns” tells the story of souls living in bodies and souls that have already let this world. Top three male & female runners in each category & top three overall.

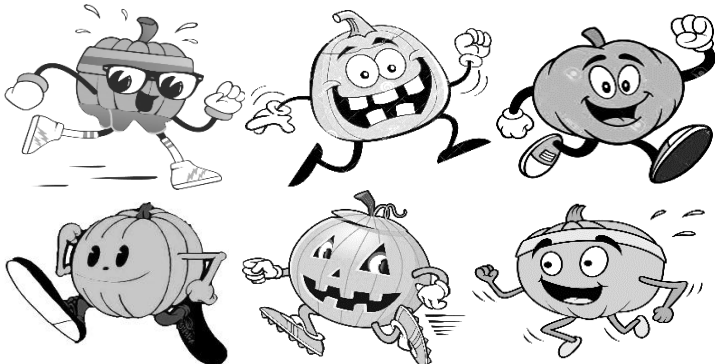

## Synodality: Diocesan Phase

Pope Francis has invited the entire Church to reflect on a theme that is decisive for its life and mission: “It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium.”

A basic question prompts and guides us: How does this “journeying together,” which takes place today, allow the Church to proclaim the Gospel in accordance with the mission entrusted to her; and what steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church? Addressing this question together requires listening to the Holy Spirit, who like the wind “blows where it wills; you can hear the sound it makes, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes,” remaining open to the surprises that the Spirit will certainly prepare for us along the way.

Our Diocese will formally open the “diocesan phase” of the synod process on Sunday, Oct 24, with Bishop Cahill celebrating the Eucharist in our Cathedral of Our Lady of Victory. Our Synod will be coordinated by Jennifer Vincent and Dr. Glenn Hunter with the assistance of Aldo Camacho and Deacon Tran Dinh. They will help organize and facilitate the consultation of faithful throughout the diocese in the upcoming months.

As the Holy Father expressed: “... We recall that the purpose of the Synod, and therefore of this consultation, is not to produce documents, but to “plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands...” These are expansive goals that only through our turning to the power and trusting the guidance of the Holy Spirit can we accomplish.

## The Prayer of the Synod: Adsumus Sancte Spiritus

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name. With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts; Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions. Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life and not stray from the way of truth and what is right. All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time, in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. Amen.

## Reminder: Rosary before Mass

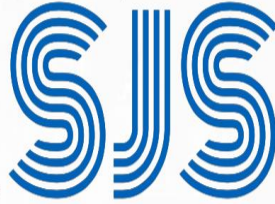
The rosary is such a beautiful devotion that helps us get our focus ready to enter more fully into the paschal mystery in its culminating experience: the Eucharist. As a reminder to all of our volunteers who assist us leading the rosary prior to Mass: To maintain simplicity (and a bit of uniformity in our practice), it should just be the rosary, announcement of the mysteries, and the prayer after the rosary followed by the St. Michael prayer. No extra invocations, prayers or expressions should be offered. This will also allow for a bit of quiet time of recollection prior to the beginning of Mass. Sometimes...the invocations--as sweet as they sound--are not always in line with our beliefs. An example: at times it has been said, "Jesus, Mary, Joseph, pray for us." Give it a thought for a moment using the litanies as a point of reference. We ask Joseph and Mary to pray for us. We ask Jesus to have mercy on us. So as pious as the intention is to invoke the holy family, it is not a proper public expression of what we believe. Keeping the rosary before Mass along with the basics and the St. Michael prayer is a beautiful tradition that we should maintain for sure. The remaining quiet time can be for individual prayer and spiritual preparation for the sacred mysteries preparing to unfold.
