
Sacrament of Matrimony

Dear Parishioners,

Next Sunday November 1st is the Solemnity of All Saints. This Solemnity is so important that we celebrate it even on Sunday. It reminds us, that becoming a Saint is the fundamental calling, vocation of every one of us. People frequently say "I'm no Saint". To which I often reply, "I hope you are". Ultimately, we are either Saints and with God for all eternity, or separated from God in Hell. Of course, what people mean when they say that I am no Saint, is that they are not perfect. None of the Saints was perfect. They all faced struggles and challenges and failures in becoming holy. That is one of the reasons why being familiar with the lives of the Saints can be very valuable and helpful for us. We become holy by spending time with Christ, and in Christ we are connected to all God's holy people. This union endures beyond death, and is what we call "The Communion of Saints". We think of this Communion of Saints of having three components, 1. The Saints who are already in Heaven (The Church Triumphant), 2. The Saints who are in purgatory completing their journey of becoming holy. (The Church Suffering), 3. The Saints living on earth as we journey to eternal life. (The Church Militant). Next Sunday, we remember especially those Saints who already share eternal happiness and that we are called to that same glory. On November 2nd, "The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed" (All Souls). We remember especially those Saints who are in purgatory and our responsibility to pray for them. As we celebrate All Saints Day, may we deepen our commitment to grow in holiness.
