

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is celebrated with the parish community every first Wednesday at 5:00 pm Mass. Yet, anytime, anointing is available for illness, preparation for surgery or for recovery, by calling Fr Tony.

<u>Baptism:</u> Congratulations on the birth of your child! Your Church Family is excited about your family growing and our family growing! We look forward to celebrating your child's baptism! Preparation for new parents or those new to the parish is held by appointment. Call Fr Tony.

<u>Marriage:</u> Congratulations on your engagement! Your Church Family wishes to help you fully prepare spiritually and walk with you into this lifetime commitment to each other. In order to allow sufficient time, couples must contact the parish office at least 6 months before the anticipated wedding date.

<u>Confession/Reconciliation:</u> Every Wednesday 4:00-4:45 pm; every Saturday 4:00-4:45 pm, every first Saturday after 8:00 am Mass, or anytime by simply asking or calling Fr Tony for appointment.

<u>Visitation of the Sick:</u> Please notify Father or the office upon admission of a family member into nursing homes or hospital. Often we rely upon word from the family about illnesses of a member. Please call.

RCIA: Interested in the Catholic Faith? The RCIA process is a "spiritual journey" that fully initiates those who are not baptized or who have baptism from another tradition and wish to join fully the Catholic Church. Classes are offered through the year culminating at Easter! Please call the office for details!



GOSPEL MEDITATION

March 24, 2019 3rd Sunday of Lent

"There once was a person who had a fig tree planted in his orchard, and when he came in search of fruit on it [he] found none." We live in a results-driven society. It can be easy to put pressure on ourselves to succeed. If we're not keeping up with the perceived "good life" of those around us, we feel anxious and disappointed. Some of the Gospel stories about fruitfulness can seem to play out in this fashion. "For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. So cut it down." The message seems to be clear. Abide in God and bear fruit! Stand apart from God and be barren. But what happens when we're trying, but the growth we wanted doesn't seem to be coming our way? What if it feels like life just isn't bearing fruit?

This Sunday, Jesus gives us a sign of hope. "[The gardener] said to him in reply, 'Sir, leave it for this year also ? it may bear fruit in the future." How quick we can be to judge! Perhaps you started out Lent with high hopes and big ideas for getting closer to God. Maybe things haven't gone exactly like you thought. It can be easy to lose patience with our failures or slow growth. We shouldn't be too quick to assume that God has given up on us. He hasn't.



The Egg Hunt is scheduled for Saturday-April 20th at 11:00AM. We will start promptly at 11AM-so please arrive 15 minutes early to register your child. We will begin in the gym and separate the age groups from there.

The Egg Hunt will be held RAIN OR SHINE. Age Categories: 0-23 months (hunt eggs in gym) 24 months-3 years old (hunt eggs in gym) 4-6 years old (hunt eggs by ball field & playground)

Lenten Penitential Practices

The Church asks the faithful to observe the following practices during Lent: FAST -to refrain from eating more than one full meal on ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY. Those asked to observe the fast are those who are in the age category of 18-59 who are in good health.

ABSTINENCE – to refrain from eating meat on ASH WEDNESDAY, GOOD FRIDAY, and ALL FRIDAYS during the season. Those asked to observe the abstinence are those age 14 and up. **ALMSGIVING** -the practice of treating all things, the earth and one's own life (time, talent and treasure) as belonging to God, and oneself as the manager, or 'steward" and therefore sharing resources with the needy.
