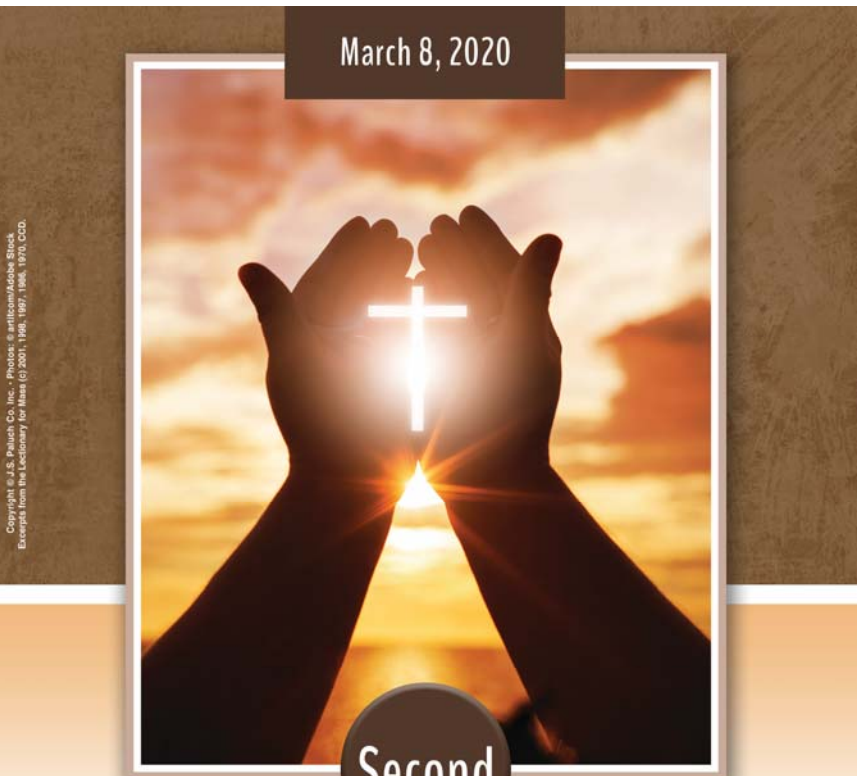

Confirmation for next fall, if you have a student that needs to be confirmed (8th grade or older) please notify Gayle Poole.

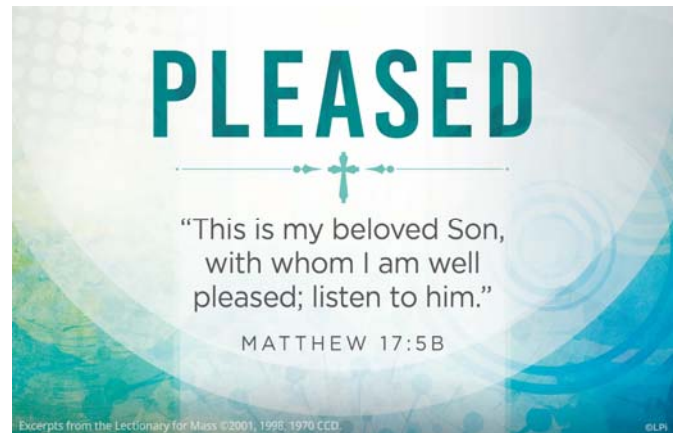

March 8th, 2020
2nd Sunday of Lent
