St. Romuald Cemetery Update:

We are currently working on mapping the cemetery in advance of putting our cemetery on an electronically location service. The new service, when completed, will enable you to find any plot in our cemetery through a GPS-like software and be viewed on your smart phone. We are in the first phase of this which included using ground penetrating rods to determine where people are buried in unmarked graves. These graves have been marked by the small white crosses you may have noticed in the old part of the cemetery. Now we must validate all the current markers to ensure correct names and dates with our records.

If anyone would like to help with this validation process, please call the office (270-756-2356) and let Jane know.

The Cemetery Committee, in it's meeting last week, determined that due to the upkeep of our cemetery, with mowing and lighting, needs to generate more funds to keep up with expenses. Therefore, we felt it was necessary to raise the price of each plot to \$400.00, which is still lower than most cemeteries in our diocese.

We have a brochure in the office that explains the polices for monuments and decorations. The following rules apply to decorations & monuments:

Decorations

- Cemetery personnel are not responsible for damages to items located on the ground during the mowing season.
- Parties responsible for damage to monuments or items placed on monuments will be determined by admission or a qualified third party opinion.
- Shepherd's hooks, monument saddles and perpetual lamps are permitted at all times. Perpetual lamps must not be located on plots during the mowing season.
- Shrubs, trees, ground cover plants, decorative rocks, trellises/arbors, statues etc. are not permitted in the cemetery.

Monuments

- Footer/foundation specification information can be obtained from the church office.
- A representative must be present or prior arrangements made before excavation.
- Symbols contrary to the Catholic faith will not be etched or placed on monuments.
- Veteran markers must be located at the foot of existing monuments preferably ground level or attached to the monument. Veteran markers may be used as a headstones.
- Monuments to designate cremains buried in occupied burial plots must be placed at the foot or adjacent to the existing headstone if space is available.
- Benches are allowed as headstones only and must be mounted on a granite base.
- Monuments/Veteran Markers placed at the foot of plots must be either ground level or at least six inches in height not to exceed ten inches.

K-6th Religious Education Registration

- ◆ Registration forms are also available on the Church's website at www.stromuald.org You will see the link on the Home page under the large photo. It says K-6th Religious Ed Registration Papers. Please print them off and complete for your child.
- ◆ Return Forms by one of the following choices: Place in envelope & put in weekend's collection basket. You may return them to the Church office M-F 8AM-3PM (please wear a mask & place in basket inside front door)
- ◆ The first day of K-6th Religious Education classes will be **Sunday, August 30th 8:15-9:30** in the elementary building as last year. This is subject to change if anything changes with the start of school.
- ◆ Due to the Coronavirus, we realize that some parents may not be comfortable sending their children to Rel Ed class on Sunday mornings. If this is the case, you may purchase the Rel Ed book and teach your child at home. We still request you fill out registration paperwork and return the book fee.
- ◆ Once classes begin and if the schools are closed due to Coronavirus, we will send the books home with your children.
- ◆ Please know we will be taking every precaution to make Religious Ed class time as safe as possible for your children. Temperatures will be taken before anyone enters the building along with everyone wearing a mask. During class time, the children will be 6 ft apart.

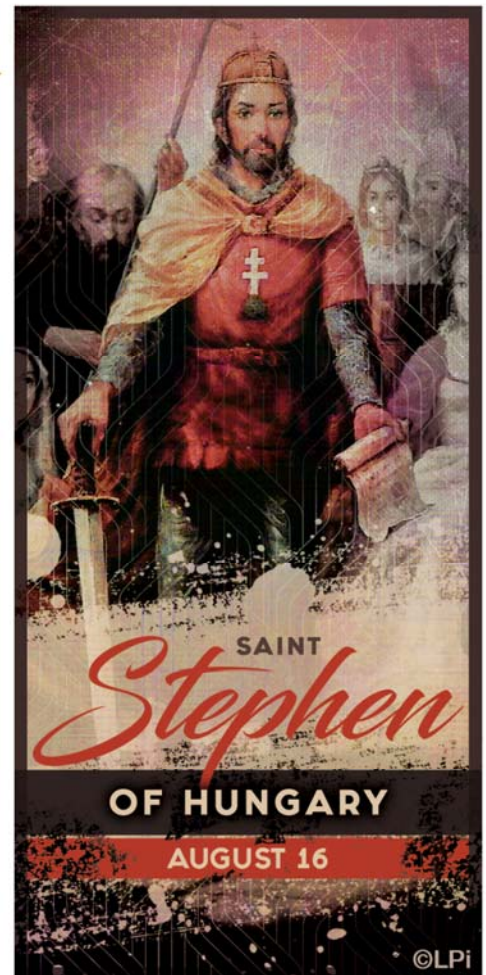
