RESPECT LIFE

The "Fetus": For many years, their most significant and basic argument has been that the so-called fetus is not a human life. They also claim that the question of when human life begins is uncertain and a religious issue. However, medical textbooks and scientific reference works consistently agree that life begins at conception, when a genetically distinct individual is brought into existence. Some of the world's most prominent scientists and physicians testified to a U.S. Senate committee that human life begins at conception.
