RESPECT LIFE

The Crossing of Manitowoc County Welcomes You To Our Virtual Unmasked Gala: check it out at: <https://www.crossingmanitowoc.org/unmaskedgala> **COME SEE DIVIDED HEARTS OF AMERICA:** This documentary film looks at abortion, one of the most divisive issues of our time. It will be screened at Roncalli High School in Manitowoc on **Sunday and Monday, October 24 and 25, 2021, at 6:30 p.m.** each day. Admission is free, but monetary donations or gifts of supplies such as diapers, formula, clothing, etc. will be accepted to support the local pregnancy help center The Crossing. The film's Executive Producer Ben Watson (a member of the 2005 Super Bowl champion Philadelphia Eagles) described his goal for the documentary as "...to unveil the truth about abortion, the laws, the history and where our country is headed. I believe in the sanctity of life, be it in the womb or on your deathbed. That's my conviction. But with the film, I'll engage those who disagree and hear their reasoning. The No. 1 thing I'm looking for is empathy on both sides." Watson compiled more than 30 interviews with prominent men and women on both sides of the abortion issue. The film screening is sponsored by Respect Life Ministry of St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church, Manitowoc, with financial support from the Catholic Foundation for the Diocese of Green Bay, Inc. through a Monica Meyer Grant. **MANITOWOC NEEDS YOU!** It is not too late to join *Manitowoc Prayerful Walkers* during this last week of the Fall 2021 40 Days for Life vigil which ends **Sun.
