

## Questions for the Week - May 3, 2020

### **4th Sunday of Easter World Day of Prayer for Vocations**



**Life Question:** How do you measure the influence of the words you speak, the emails you circulate, the jokes you tell?

**Gospel Question:** How do you understand the metaphor of Jesus as the gate of the sheepfold?

**Reading I: Acts 2: 14a, 36-41** St Peter's Pentecost sermon sets the pattern for future such speeches. First is a connection with current events; then the Jesus kerygma, framed as a reproach of the listeners; then some Scriptural reference(s) and a call to repentance.

**Psalm 23** The Lord is my Shepherd

**Reading II: I Peter 2: 20b-25** Here we have a part of a primitive Christian hymn. In it, the Suffering Servant of Isaiah becomes both the Good Shepherd and our guardian.

**The Gospel: John 10: 1-10** The parable of the sheepfold precedes a consideration of Our Lord Jesus as both the Gate and the Good Shepherd of His flock.

## May 3, 2020 – Fourth Sunday of Easter


Most mornings find me driving a fairly busy route to the parish church where I assist with Masses in my working retirement. I get a form of the “morning rush hour” so loved by the TV traffic reporters. Be that as it may, I often wind up riding behind either a driver who favors 43 mph in the legal 50 mph, or in front of another with a keen desire to inhale my exhaust as he/she is doing 60 in the same zone. On one of those recent mornings traveling in South Jersey farmland brought me alongside a scene of grazing sheep “safely grazing” to quote the hymn. Munching contentedly their farm grown breakfast, they were sharp contrast to the human activity.

This “Good Shepherd Sunday” offers us an opportunity to consider that ancient occupation, mostly missing on modern job applications and what it might teach us. Shepherding in Jesus’ time had all the dimensions of a “24/7” task, as we might describe it. The person so designated had to literally live with his herd of dependents around the clock. He or she had to be an outdoor type, sometimes compelled to be the actual “gate” as they stretched out at night across the gap in the stone fence that acted as a pen for the herd. The pay was usually nothing to blow a ram’s horn about. Still it was good work, enough for a person to take care of him/herself and any dependents. And if the shepherd was truly good, there developed a healthy respect for their woolly charges. Such a person was the exact opposite of those wandering strangers seeking only a paycheck, with no interest whatever in the sheep.

Our Lord was in such good touch with the reality of His day that when He assumed the teacher’s role, He described Himself as the Good Shepherd with all that implied. Is it any wonder that St. Peter’s current successor, Pope Francis, has urged his bishops and priests to acquire “the smell of the sheep?” But that also means that the lay faithful of the Church, the sheep, be far more than “contented grazers” along the highway. Or just be Sunday “pew warmers” when the world is so cold towards Christ every day of the week.

Bud Wilkinson, a famous football coach, was once asked, “What contribution does professional sport make to the physical fitness of Americans?” To no one’s surprise, he answered, “Very little. A professional football game,” he said, “is a happening where fifty thousand spectators, desperately needing exercise, sit in the stands watching twenty-two men on the field, desperately needing rest.” Let that description never fit our Church dear friends. Especially in this unusual time, Our Good Shepherd deserves our best.

Since we are unable to attend Mass because of the restrictions put in place due to COVID-19, the changes we are being asked to make in our everyday lives and routines likely will leave us *more* in need of God’s grace—not less.

Even if you are stuck at home, you aren’t alone and you are encouraged to join your brothers and sisters in Christ by worshipping, adoring, and praying online or with the television. Father Okon’s Mass is posted on the website each week and he includes a Spiritual Communion. You can do this daily.

To make a spiritual communion:

Simply place yourself in the presence of God, who is everywhere and already with you.

Express silently, or in words, your desire to unite with Christ in the Most Blessed Sacrament.

This prayer from St. Alphonsus Ligouri may help you:

***My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.***

**Nudge inquirers and motivate discerners to learn more about monastic life, apostolic life, missionaries, cloistered contemplative life, and evangelical Franciscan life.**

**Ignite our Church with the confident humility that there is an urgent need for religious sisters, brothers, deacons, and priests to live in solidarity with those who are poor, neglected, and marginalized.**

**Disrupt our comfortable lives and complacent attitudes with new ideas to respond courageously and creativity with a daily 'YES!' Amen.**

While we are not meeting in church these weeks, we encourage you to continue your participation in the life of our Church and parish, especially by praying for vocations:

- **What Can I Do? Video by Gino DiMattia, Serra Club of Lima, OH, which imagines a parish with no priest to celebrate Mass. It will make you stop and think about what we take for granted, especially after these weeks when we have not been able to go to Mass and receive Eucharist; maybe we take the presence of our priest for granted.**
- **Mary, Queen of Apostles, pray to the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the vineyard.**

## Sacrament of Baptism

Congratulations on the birth of your child. The Sacrament of Baptism is normally administered after the 11:30 AM Mass on Sunday. Pre-Jordan class for the parents is required prior to the scheduling of the Baptism. Parents can attend the class before the baby is born. Pre-Jordan class is held on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:00 PM. Please contact the Parish Office at 610.459.2203 to register for the Pre-Jordan class. To schedule a Baptism, please have already obtained the certificates of eligibility and then contact the Parish Office at least two weeks in advance.

## Certificates of Eligibility

Congratulations on being asked to be a sponsor at either a Baptism or a Confirmation. You have been asked to be a witness to, and role model of, your Catholic faith. A sponsor is a Roman Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation, is an active registered member of his or her parish, at least 16 years of age, and if married is in a Sacramental Marriage. ## Elementary Catholic School Education


