Office hours are: Open 9:00am—1:00 pm; CLOSED 1:00—1:30; Open 1:30—4:30pm; CLOSED FRIDAYS during the summer.

The following mitigating guidelines are:

- ♦ Most parish business will be conducted as **curbside business**. Contact the parish office by email or phone (parishoffice@sfdslenni.org or (610)459-2203) Your request will be filled and placed in the mailbox attached to the left wall beside the Office door and you will be notified when it will be available for pickup. If you need to drop something off, please use the same mailbox.
- ♦ **The office door will only be opened for those who have scheduled an appointment in advance.** Only one person/family unit will be allowed in the office at a time and **all who enter must wear a mask/face covering in the office.**
- ♦ Social distancing within the office will be maintained at all times.

Mass Update

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is not lifted at this time. Those elderly or compromised for health reasons and those not comfortable with being in a crowd may continue to watch live streamed/recorded Mass, observing the Sabbath.

St. Francis De Sales will observe the following Mass schedule:

- ♦ Sunday Mass on July 25th and 26th with modified schedule; 5:00PM Saturday Vigil (will be taped and posted) and **7:30AM & 9:30AM Sunday**
- ♦ Week of July 26th, Weekday Masses are scheduled at 8:30 AM. Check schedule weekly. **NO** Communion service on days Mass is not scheduled.

In accordance with directives from the Archdiocese and CDC, masks/face coverings are to be worn while in church.

At this time, Communion is distributed on the hand only.

Questions for the Week - June 26, 2020

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: 1 Kings 3: 5, 7-12 In his dream, Solomon answers God's gift offer by asking for "an understanding heart to judge your people and to distinguish right from wrong." God was pleased with that request.. *What do you want to ask God for right now and do you think he would be pleased with your request?*

Psalm 119: Lord, I love your commands.

Reading II: Romans 8: 28-30 Through the Holy Spirit, the Christian becomes a child of God, being conformed to the Son's image, and destined for justification and glory. *How do you see God's image in yourself? In others?*

The Gospel: Matthew 13: 44-52 Jesus uses three parables to describe the kingdom of God.

Have you registered your child for Religious Education this year? Are you thinking about your child receiving a sacrament?

P.R.E.P. Registration forms for 2020-2021 are past due. We will offer a variety of formats on Sunday morning and/or homeschooling, BUT YOU MUST REGISTER YOUR CHILD.

We are also in need of two Catechists and several adult and high school aides. Please consider contacting Sister Anne Marie about these parish participation/service opportunities.

You must register for PREP to be included in receiving the sacraments of Confirmation, First Penance, and First Holy Communion for 2021. A child must consistently receive religious education for at least 2 years before entering a sacramental program.

July 26, 2020

17th Sunday in ORDINARY TIME

Remember "multiple choice tests?" They could be like a casino trip to the guys and gals that didn't study and just gambled with their choices. Or the tests were brain teasers for the rest of us for one reason: there always seemed to be those two pesky choices very close in meaning, yet only one was fully correct. Here's another fact: those tests were tough to compose, and I speak from experience.

As time went past our schooldays, we quickly came to know that life itself almost daily came up with multiple options everywhere we looked. This held true in matters both trite and tremendous. Chief among the latter was our choice of religious belief and practice. Everyone has to choose in this example. Jesus Christ is one Person who confronts everyone with a choice. He knows better than we that there are options. But He would agree that not to decide is to decide.

The Apostles Christ chose are often held up as the original holy ones of our Catholic Faith. They are touted as brave evangelizers. But we have to remember that they were ordinary people of the type that we might find walking down the street or bumping into us at the supermarket. When they witnessed Jesus' cruel and unjustified execution, they had to feel let down and acutely disappointed. Here they had given up their ordinary lives to follow this man they called "the Master," and He couldn't even master His fate! Or so they thought.

The resurrection squelched such doubts immediately for them, with St. Thomas' belief just slightly delayed. From that moment on, they were taught and learned a great deal about their new life and its fulfillment. Among the components of that knowledge was the clear call to be as wise as Solomon. They had learned to recognize that the kingdom of God is the main treasure in life. It is indeed the "pearl of great price." They would hope, like all of us, to be caught up in the Lord's "fishing net" as one of the healthy and desirable fish.

So much for the Apostles. But how about you and me? Most of us have heard these gospels read to us for years. We have also read them for ourselves. Has their message "sunk in"? Despite the fact that the truth may have gotten through to us, how do we handle our doubts and fears? How do we handle those cloudy days that take away the sunshine? Like that shocking medical diagnosis we did not expect? Or the death of a loved one? That job loss? That betrayal by a friend? The list can be long for some of us.

But then along come faith and hope, that indomitable pair of divine gifts that are fostered each week by the Eucharist. I know that is principally why we all missed gathering together for it during the pandemic shutdown. Our souls were starving. Not having any choice in the matter didn't help either. Our basic freedom was curtailed. How great to have it back! In the meantime, may we keep fresh in our minds this wise conclusion from an unknown author: "Nothing great was ever done without an act of decision. Especially when the choices were multiple."

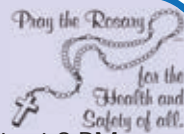

Sacrament of Baptism

Congratulations on the birth of your child. The Sacrament of Baptism is normally administered after the 11:30 AM Mass on Sunday. Pre-Jordan class for the parents is required prior to the scheduling of the Baptism. **Parents can attend the class before the baby is born.** Pre-Jordan class is held on the second Tuesday of each month at 7:00 PM. Please contact the Parish Office at 610.459.2203 to register for the Pre-Jordan class. To schedule a Baptism, please have already obtained the certificates of eligibility and then contact the Parish Office at least two weeks in advance.

Certificates of Eligibility

Congratulations on being asked to be a sponsor at either a Baptism or a Confirmation. You have been asked to be a witness to, and role model of, your Catholic faith. A sponsor is a Roman Catholic who has received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation, is an active registered member of his or her parish, at least 16 years of age, and if married is in a Sacramental Marriage.
