

From the Pastor's Desk:

Next Sunday, we will be celebrating the Rite of Acceptance and Rite of Welcoming for our RCIA Candidates and Catechumens. We are very blessed as a parish to have a number who are studying the Faith this year. This rite is the first major gateway in the process. According to the Church's ritual book, those going through this rite are "assembling publicly for the first time to declare their intention

to the Church and the Church, in turn, carrying out its apostolic mission, accepts them as persons who intend to become its members...they prepare to be sealed with the gift of the Spirit in Confirmation [and, of course, to receive the most important Initiation Sacrament of Baptism if they have not yet done so], and take their place at the Banquet Table of Christ's sacrifice." (RCIA 41, 412)

So, in effect, the candidates are declaring that they do hope and intend to eventually become Catholics, and the Church is affirming their desire and strengthening them. I know that you will join me in deepening our prayer for them now that they will have taken this first step.

Also this week, we mark Veterans Day on November 11. Veterans Day reminds us of those important virtues of self-sacrifice, courage, and love of God and country. Here is a prayer we might pray for peace on this day:

O Lord, Jesus Christ, who in Thy mercy hears the prayers of sinners, pour forth, we beseech Thee, all grace and blessing upon our country and its citizens. We pray particularly for the President, for Congress, for all our soldiers, for all who defend us in ships, whether on the seas or in the skies, for all who are suffering the hardships of war. We pray for all who are in peril or in danger. Bring us all, after the troubles of this life, into the haven of peace, and reunite us all together forever, O dear Lord, in Thy glorious heavenly kingdom. Amen.
