



PASTOR'S COLUMN:

It's just that they will be the immediate administrative heads of their respective parishes. I have full confidence in Fr. Hartge and Fr. Dooley and look forward to working with them as they take on greater responsibility in the consortium.

Feast of Corpus Christi – The Feast of the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ

Dear Parishioners:

I wanted to run this more extensive presentation about reverence for Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. The Eucharist is the Supreme Gift of the Lord to His Church – His Living Presence – Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

1st – Preparing to Receive

- All Catholics who receive Holy Communion are bound to **fast** for a full hour before receiving the Blessed Sacrament (this means no food or drink one hour before receiving Holy Communion – exceptions to this rule include water and medicine).
- Although **chewing gum** is not technically breaking the fast, it is still disrespectful to do so in Mass and it is completely disrespectful to receive Communion with gum still in the mouth.
- **Prayer and Silence:** In the time before the Mass, we should be praying and asking the Holy Spirit to help us to receive what the Lord wants to give to us. This is not meant to be the time to be catching up on the latest gossip and news – the Christian life supposes we are already speaking to our neighbors and friends outside of the Mass. The Mass is where we give God the attention. The analogy would be if a friend invited you to their house and then you spent the time talking to other people and ignored the host. The Lord has invited you for this hour, it is time for Him. Afterwards, we can and should visit with our friends out in the street or over at coffee and donuts. Others may want to spend that time making a prayer of thanksgiving as is encouraged by the Church and then go out and join the gang.
- **Proper Dress:** St. Peter's Basilica in Rome has a simple dress code: No shorts, bare shoulders or miniskirts. This applies to both men and women. This is to help emphasize the dignity of the church and of the Holy Eucharist. Remember that our attire and our behavior affect not only us but also teach the young through symbol what we believe.

Is the Basilica dress code too strict? There may be days where we're coming from or going to something that prevents us from dressing up, but certainly we could take the Basilica's rule as a good standard. Another standard I've heard is that we should simply make sure that we are not dressed up more on any other day of the week than Sunday. The point of this rule is to make sure that we hold the Sunday Eucharist to be more important and worthy than anything else we do in the week. A final rule some use is to ask ourselves how would we dress if we were going to meet the president? Do we dress better or worse for our Lord?

2nd – Receiving Holy Communion

On approaching the Eucharist we should **bow** or **genuflect**. When we receive just the Host or just the Chalice we are still receiving both the Body *and* Blood of Jesus. Both are fully present under each form. If we are walking around the chalice as not to receive it, we would still make a bow to it.

To receive: **We say "Amen"** and then either keep our mouth open, where the priest or minister can place the host, or we form our hands like a "throne" for our Lord: one hand on top of the other like a cross. "*We receive* communion, we don't *take* it" – If we receive on the hand we should consume in sight of the minister. In other words do not walk away – I will and I am asking other ministers to do the same: follow those who do not immediately receive and ask them to please do so. This will cut down on the chance for sacrilege.

If you see someone walking away with a host and not consuming, please either ask them to receive or alert the priest or an usher who could then ask them. The Eucharist is a gift, but it is a gift that must be protected. If you find a host on the ground or in a pew, please return it to the priest.

Once a host or the wine is consecrated, it remains truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Our Lord until it loses its form (when the host is so broken down that it no longer has the appearances of bread or the wine is so diluted that it no longer has the appearances and property of wine – the *matter* is important in the existence of a Sacrament).

Once we have received Communion at Mass we should return to our pew and give thanks to God for the incredible gift we have received – a glance at the mural will remind us of what it cost the Lord and what Love has motivated Him.

3rd – Bringing Communion to the Homebound

- In our parish we are blessed with many who bring communion to the sick and homebound. If you or a loved one need Communion brought to a hospital or home, please let us know. If you have in the past but are not a currently listed Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion and you want to bring Communion to a family member or friend, please contact me before doing so.
- If you are bringing Communion to the sick or homebound, please remember to go directly to the person's place of residence (please do not bring Our Lord into the grocery store or out to breakfast or such). If for some reason you end up with an extra host or portion of a host, please either immediately return to the church, or consume. No one should be walking around with a host or portion of a host in their pyx. It is the Lord.

4th – Who should receive Holy Communion

The Mass is more than Holy Communion. In fact in many other countries like Mexico or some of the European countries, sometimes you attend Mass where the majority of people don't receive Communion. This is because they are aware of the guidelines that regulate the reception of Holy Communion. They are also aware that the most important aspect of the Mass is the offering of the Sacrifice of the Mass – which they can unite their prayers to regardless of whether they plan on receiving Communion. Why we wouldn't receive Communion:

- 1) If we have never prepared for and been brought into the Church through Baptism or a Profession of Faith and Confirmation. (If you are in this boat, please contact us about our upcoming Inquiry classes into the Faith that will begin in the Fall.)
- 2) If we have never made our First Communion.
- 3) If we are currently living as husband and wife and have not been married by a Catholic priest or deacon or had our marriage brought into the Church.
- 4) If we are aware of unconfessed mortal sin [and it's easier to sin mortally than we might think: even missing a Sunday Mass or Holyday of Obligation without legitimate reason (sick or truly unable to make it) can put us in this boat].
- 5) If we ate food leading up to the Mass and won't have a full hour in before Communion.
- 6) If we have already received Communion twice that day.
- 7) If we think we should be in a better frame of mind before we receive.

In today's Gospel, the disciples suggest that Jesus disperse the crowd so that they might individually seek food and lodging. The miracle of the feeding of the five thousand is Jesus' powerful reminder that when we share our gifts in His name there is always more than enough!
