



## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

### Anointing of the Sick

This Sunday is the World Day for the Sick – which when it does not fall on a Sunday is also the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, when we recall Our Lady's appearance at Lourdes, France where the waters continue to be conduits through which the Lord heals. This weekend during the Masses therefore, we will be celebrating the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Catholics eligible for the sacrament include:

[From the *Instruction on the Pastoral Care of the Sick*]

- A person who is seriously sick – the sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious.
- A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery.
- Elderly people may be anointed if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present.
- Sick children may be anointed *if they have sufficient use of reason* [are of confession age] to be strengthened by the sacrament.

After the Masses this weekend the prayer ministry team will pray with anyone else wanting prayers (e.g., for addictions, minor illnesses, strength, faith, etc.).

### Lent Begins

This Wednesday begins the 40 days of Lent. Forty days of being with our Lord in the desert. This is a time of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. These are the traditional disciplines that help free us to grow closer to the Lord.

A reminder on the specific church disciplines of these forty days:

1. Lent is the penitential season of the Church's year. It runs from Ash Wednesday to the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. There are six Sundays in Lent. The sixth is named Passion (or Palm) Sunday and starts Holy Week.
2. To FAST means to eat one full meal and two lesser meals. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of FAST, and are kept by those aged 18 to 59. One is encouraged to fast on other days, too, throughout the year.
3. To ABSTAIN means to refrain from eating meat, and soups or gravies made from meat. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence, as are all Fridays in Lent. Catholics aged 14 and older are bound to abstain from meat.
4. We may observe fast and abstinence on other days, of course. Other practices, such as daily Mass, Bible reading and study, extra prayer, the Stations of the Cross, works of mercy, almsgiving, etc., are highly encouraged and not limited to Lent.

**11:00 a.m.-12:00 noon, on Tuesday – need one adorer (help is especially needed during the tax season coming up.)**

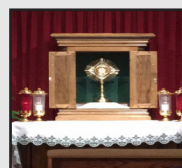

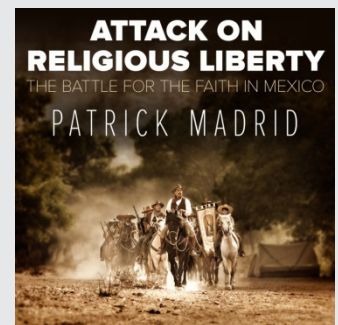
