



### From the Pastor's Desk

Next week is Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. Since there is so much to say about Holy Week, I thought I would run this yearly reminder of the events of Holy Week in two columns, this week and next. The beginning of Holy Week is marked by the blessing of palms at Palm Sunday Mass (also known as Passion Sunday). The Church requests a solemn procession at one of the Masses. This will occur at the 11:30 a.m. Mass, beginning in the parish center and proceeding to the Church. In this, we commemorate the entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem, as we wave our palms and sing in triumph.

The first big event after Palm Sunday is the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral. This is concelebrated by the Bishop and many priests of the diocese. At this Mass the holy oils are blessed for the year, and then are brought back to each parish of the diocese. The Mass begins at 6:00 p.m. at St. Joseph Cathedral.

The Triduum (Latin meaning: "The Sacred Three Days") – Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil, is the great culmination of the liturgical year.

On the first day of the Triduum, Holy Thursday, Mass will begin here at 7:00 p.m. In this Mass, we commemorate the institution of the priesthood, the Eucharist, and a love that is stronger than death. In the past, the foot washing ceremony during the Holy Thursday was meant to display both the institution of the priesthood and the universal charity of Christ. This is why the church's guidelines asked that twelve men be chosen to represent the twelve Apostles. Two years ago, the Holy Father, Pope Francis, changed the ritual to reflect exclusively the charity of Christ and not to represent the institution of the priesthood. Therefore, he has asked that in addition to explaining this change to the faithful, that pastors who choose to do this optional rite would choose a few of the faithful to represent the diversity of the Christian community (old, young, sick, lay, religious, male, female, etc.). Therefore, we will have six persons representing all of the faithful.

The Holy Thursday Mass concludes with a solemn procession of the Eucharist from the Church to a "Garden Chapel" which will be in the Adoration Chapel. Here we will have the chance to continue in Adoration, "watching with Him" in his time in the Garden of Gethsemane.

**Presence to the Poor...**Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy.



**Feeding the hungry** – Donate items to the Food Pantry – current needs are canned fruit, corn, and peas, pasta meals in pull top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and soup.

**Clothing the Naked** – When you donate items to Goodwill, ask for a Donation receipt and bring to the St. Vincent de Paul Society.

They are given credit for each bag of clothing given and can use it to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

**Alms for the Poor** – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. 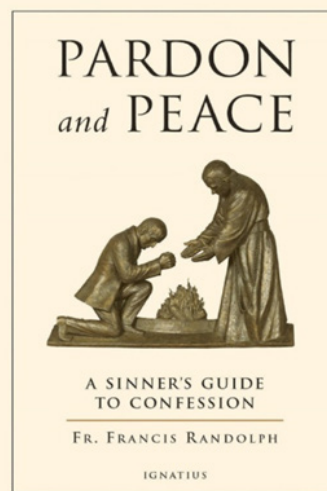

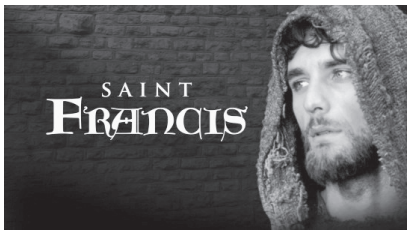
