



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In last week's column, I left off with the description of Holy Thursday. The evening ends with quiet Adoration of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. On Good Friday, we remember the Crucifixion of the Lord. This is a day of fasting and abstinence throughout the whole Church. Confession will be available here from 1:00-2:30 p.m.

In the Liturgy of Good Friday, there are three main parts.

The Service begins at 3:00 p.m. as the priest, deacon, and servers enter in silence. They make a reverence and prostrate themselves. All pray silently for a while. The priest then prays the opening prayer and then we move into Part I: The Liturgy of the Word. We listen to a reading from the Prophet Isaiah, the Letter to the Hebrews, and then join in the Gospel of John's narrative of the Passion – read as the narrative was read on Palm Sunday. This part concludes with the singing of the General Intercessions, in which we pray for the needs of the Church, the pope, the clergy, Christians, Jews, and nonbelievers. Part II is the Veneration of the Cross, in which we "Behold the Wood of the Cross, on which hung the Salvation of the World." The community then comes forward to venerate the Cross by making a bow or genuflection in front of it, or kissing its wood. Part III is the reception of Holy Communion (the hosts will have been consecrated at the Mass on Holy Thursday Evening). The Service concludes as it began, in silence.

The Divine Mercy Novena also begins this day. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be sung in the Church at 7:00 p.m. It will be prayed each of the following days at 3:00 p.m. up until and including Divine Mercy Sunday (the Sunday after Easter).

The Easter Vigil, Saturday evening at 8:45 p.m., is also called "the mother of all vigils." The vigil consists of four parts. Part I is a brief service of light, in which the Easter Candle is lit for the first time, and is processed into the Church. Part II is the Liturgy of the Word, in which a number of readings are read and psalms sung that recount the events leading to our salvation in Jesus Christ. Part III is Baptism of our catechumens and the reception of our candidates into the Church. Part IV is the Liturgy of the Eucharist, "when the whole Church is called to the table which the Lord has prepared for his people through his death and resurrection." The Mass ends with the great "Alleluia" being sung in joy at the Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

I strongly encourage you to be at as many of the Holy Week events as you can. Don't be one of the "good-weather" Christians, who join to sing "Hosanna" to Jesus on Palm Sunday, only to abandon Him until they can sing "Alleluia" on Easter Sunday. Walk with Him through His Passion and Death, that you might more fully experience the glory of His Resurrection. May this Holiest Week of the year be a time of grace for you and your family.

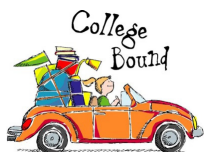

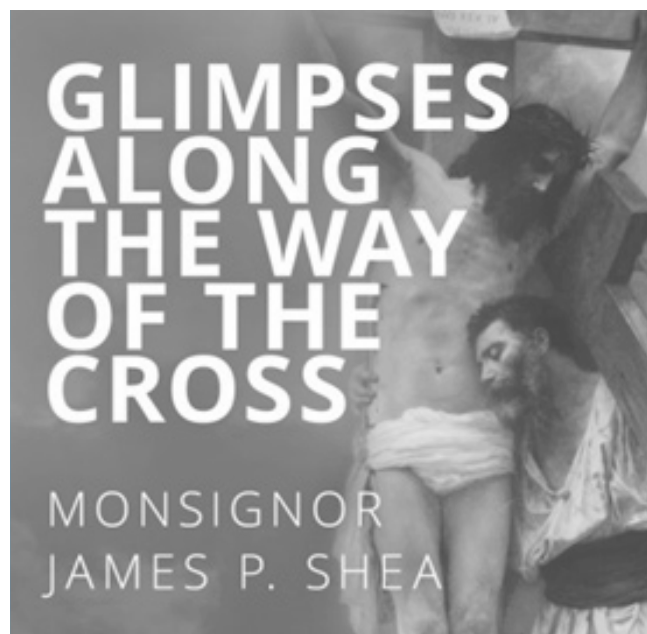

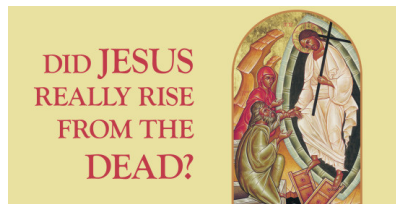
PICK OF THE WEEK, March 25, 2018

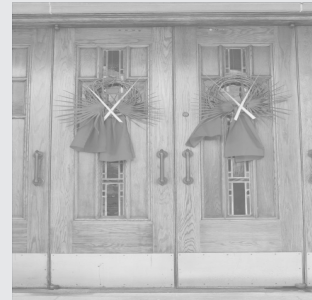
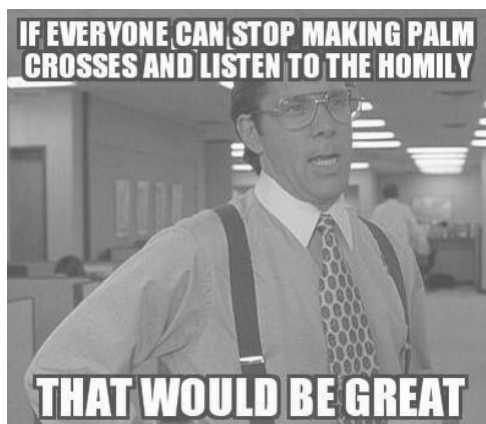
Teen Pick of the Week of March 25, 2018 –

If Christ has not been raised, said the Apostle Paul, then Christian Faith is in vain. The Resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth is not an incidental or minor aspect of Christianity. If Jesus did not rise from the dead, Christianity is certainly false.

Skeptics have long tried to show that there was no Resurrection. Today, there has been a resurgence of attacks on this central truth of Christianity. Some people claim that the followers of Jesus fabricated the Resurrection. Others argue that the disciples hallucinated or had a "vision" of their dead master, which they confused with a truly risen Jesus. Others still suggest that the Resurrection was a myth or that the Apostles may have seen a spirit or witnessed a "spiritual resurrection" that had nothing to do with an empty tomb and the transformation of Jesus's dead body. *Did Jesus Really Rise from the Dead?* carefully scrutinizes the historical evidence. Rather than accept Christian belief blindly, top scholars, and biblical historians critically examine alternative explanations. In the end, they show why it is a matter of sound reason as well as faith to affirm what the early Church proclaimed: Jesus is risen.

A fascinating, fast-paced, exciting exploration of Jesus's fate, *Did Jesus Really Rise from the Dead?* shows how Jesus' Resurrection has consequences for every one of us.
