Happy Easter and Thank You to all who worked so hard to make Holy Week a beautiful time of accompanying our Lord through His Passion and to His Resurrection. Many people did a lot of hard work and it honored our Lord and helped us all to experience the graces of the Triduum.

We are now in the octave of Easter, which concludes with the Second Sunday of Easter, better known as Divine Mercy Sunday. On this day we celebrate the great gift of God's Mercy – this day was proclaimed in response to a request by our Lord through St. Faustina. On this day we will venerate the image of the Risen Jesus. Here at St. Peter's we will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament beginning after the 11:30 a.m. Mass and concluding after the praying and singing of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at 3:00 p.m., and indoor procession.

Confessions will be heard on *Saturday* from 3:30-4:30 p.m. Please stop in and pray awhile and seek the great graces that God pours out around this special Feast.

Also, as mentioned previously, I am blessed to have the opportunity to make a sabbatical this Spring. Easter Masses will be my last duties before I leave this week to travel to Israel and the Holy Land. I will be based at the Magdala Center on the Sea of Galilee during this time. I will certainly carry you all in my prayers and ask that you do the same. I plan to be back at the end of June arriving in time for the weekend Masses of June 30/July 1 and the celebration of our parish patronal feast (St. Peter and Paul, June 29) with our parish picnic on Sunday, July 1.

*Alms for the poor –* This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter's. 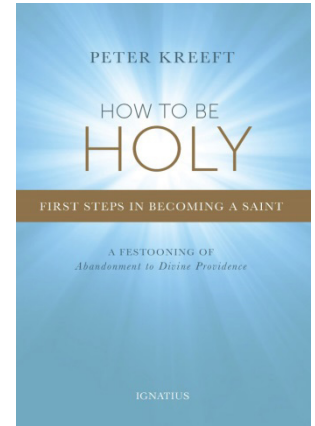

**Teen Pick of the Week of April 1, 2018 –**



The ever-popular and prolific Peter Kreeft says that the most important question he has written about is how one becomes holy, or to put it another way, how one becomes a saint. This question is central to all the great religions, and Kreeft demonstrates striving toward holiness and moving toward perfect love is the whole purpose of life. Kreeft admits that he is only a beginner on the climb to holiness, and it is to novices like him that he has written this engaging and encouraging book. Using the insights and experiences of saints and great spiritual writers throughout history, Kreeft shows what holiness is and how it can be achieved. He especially draws upon the spiritual classic *Abandonment to Divine Providence* by Jean-Pierre de Caussade, S.J. The core of Caussade's timeless gem is that God reveals himself to all of us through the daily events of our lives. The surest way toward spiritual growth,



therefore, is perceiving and accepting the merciful will of God in every situation. Kreeft stresses the simplicity of his approach to holiness, which focuses mainly on the virtue of love.
