



## **From the Pastor's Desk**

**Good-bye Fr. Hartge:** It is with sadness and joy mixed that we say good-bye to Fr. Hartge this week. Fr. Hartge has been a wonderful addition to our consortium and a joy in rectory life. We will sorely miss him. Our prayers go with him!

**Welcoming Fr. Herge:** This week, we'll be welcoming Fr. Thomas Herge to our Consortium. I guess the Bishop wanted to make it easy on us with names – even if you slip up and call him Fr. Hartge it sounds close enough that he might not catch it ☺. Fr. Herge was just ordained with the same class as Fr. Brett Garland. Fr. Herge grew up in Alabama and then studied and graduated from Ohio State University before entering the Pontifical College Josephinum Seminary. Fr. Dooley and I are looking forward to his arrival this week. He'll then be making his way around the consortium through the weekend schedules.

**Year of the Family:** Beginning July 8, our Deanery (the unit comprising the southern parishes of the diocese) is celebrating a "Year of the Family." This year is the 160th anniversary of the marriage of Blessed Louis and Zélie Martin (better known as the parents of St. Therese of Lisieux, "the Little Flower"). Their shrine in Alençon, France is hosting a Jubilee for Family this year also.

We hope to have some initiatives to help strengthen family life this year and are looking at the possibility of a Deanery "Year of the Family Conference" in the Spring. One initiative you'll notice beginning with this week's bulletin is a weekly bulletin article about concrete and practical ways to live the life of the Church in the home.

*Your Family's Cycle:* Every family has a cycle of life – for example, for many families, we're in the midst of baseball and softball season. Every year, beginning around the same time, certain routines begin (preparing equipment, practicing, etc., progressing to games, and concluding with tournaments). It affects the life of the whole family and even at times, in a good year, brings ample times to celebrate; then the going back to school routine, again roughly the same time of each year with all of its attendant preparations and "celebrations." (can I hear some parents' Amen?) On top of this calendar that is seasonal you also have a calendar that is specific to dates. The family celebrates the birthday of each member on their specific date, there is a celebration of the wedding anniversary on its specific date, etc. We can say there is a season-based calendar you follow and a specific-date calendar.

*Your Church Family's Cycle:* Your Church family is no different. There is a seasonal-based calendar (Advent, Christmas Season, Ordinary Time, Lent, Easter Season, etc.), and a specific-to-the-date calendar – the Feast of Ss. Peter and Paul, June 29, every year; St. Benedict, July 11; Assumption of Mary, August 15; St. Francis of Assisi, October 4, and so on.

What for centuries on end has helped make Catholicism so enjoyable is the living out of these seasons together as a family. Just as celebrating wins together as a family or everyone getting involved in the back to school preparations, or everyone sharing a birthday dinner bring joy and build love, so does the living out of our beautiful calendar of Catholic Life. It's good to tap into our family that spans twenty centuries and every continent – to keep the festivals that they did and do, to share the joys of the feast days, to help create in our own families the sense of belonging to a community much larger than the present age and the present place. All the while we keep before our eyes many of the "all-stars" of our family. For example, this week's article is about celebrating the feast day of St. Benedict (July 11), the founder of Western Monasticism, and thus a key figure to the building of Western Civilization itself.

You'll read about a fun and easy way to mark this celebration by making a Benedictine Pizza for dinner. You will also read a prayer to go with the day, as well as be pointed to other resources to go deeper. The Catholic Church didn't give rise to Western Civilization simply through its presentation of Truth, living of Goodness, creation of Beauty, or establishing Unity, although those were all important, it was also through giving rise to a culture that CELEBRATED all that was True, Good, Beautiful, and Unifying. We need to teach ourselves and our children that the Faith is to not only be lived, but to be joyfully celebrated – this has been the genius of Catholicism. As Hillaire Belloc once put it, "Wherever the Catholic sun doth shine, there's always laughter and good red wine. At least I've always found it so. Benedicamus Domino!"

We hope this weekly installment will help families find more ways to live a life of Faith that will one day have their children remembering and appreciating the beauty of Jesus and our Faith not only for all of its truth, goodness, unity, and beauty – but also its Joy!





**Presence to the Poor...** Helping our St. Vincent de Paul Society with its mission is an excellent way to be a presence to the poor and to perform corporal works of mercy. Hope Clinic is also in need of various volunteers, especially nurses.

**Feeding the Hungry** – donate items to the food pantry. Current needs are **canned fruit, corn, and peas, pasta meals in pull-top cans, pasta sauce, cereal, tuna, peanut butter, and SOUP.**

**Clothing the Naked** – When you donate items to Goodwill ask for a Donation receipt and bring it to the St. Vincent de Paul Society. They are given credit for each bag of clothing given, which can be used to offset the cost of the vouchers they give to those in need of clothing.

**Alms for the Poor** – This can be accomplished by several means available here at St. Peter. Supporting the St. Vincent de Paul Society during its 5th Sunday Collections and using the monthly envelope. Support other local agencies such as the Assistance House, Love Inc., and the Good Samaritan Food Pantry with monetary donations.

### July 11: St. Benedict of Nursia (480-543) - patron of Europe and students

This Father of Western Monasticism was known for his many miracles, building the abbey of Monte Cassino and his writing of The Rule, which became the foundation of monastic life in Europe. ### RECIPE: A Little “Pizza Italy” With St. Benedict (from catholiccuisine.com)

Since St. Benedict was born in Italy, we thought we’d bring a little “pizza Italy” into our hometoday. The Medal of St. Benedict is one of the Sacramentals of the Church.

#### Ingredients:

Take-and-bake cheese pizza  
1 can medium olives  
20 pepperoni slices



**Instructions:** Prior to baking, slice olives in half (length-wise) and arrange in shape of the Benedictine cross. Place pepperonis in the 4 corners (5 in each corner) to mimic the circles on the back of the St. Benedict medal. These 4 large circles hold the letters **C S P B** standing for the *Crux Sancti Patris Benedicti* (The Cross of the Holy Father Benedict). Bake and enjoy!
